Vergeer and Kunieda head Paralympic entries

Four-time gold medallist Esther Vergeer and Shingo Kunieda head the entries for the wheelchair tennis event at the 2008 Beijing Paralympics on 8-15 September. The ITF today announced the full list of entries, with 34 countries represented among the 112 competitors contesting the men's, women's and quad events.

Twenty-six-year old Vergeer, unbeaten in singles since 2003, will bid for her third successive gold medal in singles and doubles, having won both titles at the Sydney and Athens Paralympics. Netherlands dominates the women's entry, with Vergeer, Korie Homan, Jiske Griffioen and Sharon Walraven currently occupying the top four places on the world rankings. This means there is no place in the team for 1996 gold medallist Maïke Smit, who also partnered Vergeer to her two doubles victories.

The strongest challenge to the Dutch will come from world No. 5 Florence Gravelier of France, and No. 6 Annick Severans of Belgium, with China's Dong Fu-Lui representing the best home hope of success.

There is also a strong Dutch entry in the men's singles, with world No.2 Robin Ammerlaan defending his title alongside compatriots Maikel Scheffers and Ronald Vink. The title favourite is world No. 1 and ITF World Champion Shingo Kunieda of Japan, who will bid to add the singles gold medal to the doubles gold he won with compatriot Satoshi Saida in Athens.

Several other countries will be challenging for medals, with Stephane Houdet and Athens bronze medallist Michael Jeremiasz representing France, Martin Legner competing for Austria, and Stefan Olsson and Peter Wikstrom in action for Sweden following their shock victory at last week's Invacare World Team Cup.

In the quad singles, being held for just the second time, Britain's Peter Norfolk returns to defend his title against world No. 1 and Athens silver medallist David Wagner of USA. The Dutch will also be in contention following their World Team Cup victory, with their three-strong team led by world No. 5 Bas Van Erp, a bronze medallist in Athens. Wagner and compatriot Nicholas Taylor are reigning doubles champions.

The men's singles features 64 competitors, while 32 women and 16 quad players will contest their respective singles events. The draws combine direct entries with wild cards allocated by the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Committee.

The doubles events will comprise players already contesting the singles, with a maximum of 32 men's, 16 women's and eight quad pairs. The actual pairings will be confirmed later this year.

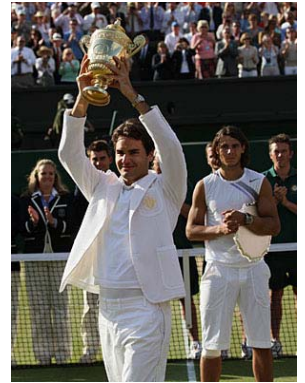


Federer and Williams begin Wimbledon defence

Defending champions Roger Federer and Venus Williams will both look to add to their impressive total of Wimbledon titles at the 2008 Championships, which begin today at the All England Club in London.

Top seed Federer is attempting to become only the second man in history to win the men's singles title for six successive years. The one previous man to do so, William Renshaw, had to win only one match in the Challenge Round each year to defend the title following his first victory in 1881. Federer is currently on a 59-match unbeaten run on grass having won at Halle this month.

Roland Garros and Queen's champion, and last year's beaten finalist Rafael Nadal is seeded No. 2, and has the chance to become the first player since Bjorn Borg to win back-to-back titles at Paris and Wimbledon. Novak Djokovic, a finalist at Queen's, is seeded No. 3 and on course for a semifinal showdown with Federer. Federer is one of only two Wimbledon champions in the draw, and could meet 2002 winner and No. 20 seed Lleyton Hewitt in the round of 16.

Venus Williams, who captured a fourth Wimbledon title in 2007, is seeded No. 7 and in the same quarter of the draw as No. 2 seed Jelena Jankovic. Jankovic's compatriot Ana Ivanovic is the number one seed following her first Grand Slam title at Roland Garros. Williams, also a winner in 2000-01 and 2005, is one of five former champions in a women's draw that also includes 2006 champion Amelie Mauresmo, 2004 winner Maria Sharapova, sister Serena Williams, champion in 2002-03, and 1999 winner Lindsay Davenport.

ITF holds sixth annual Wimbledon Junior Forum

The sixth annual ITF Wimbledon Junior Forum will take place at Digby Stuart College in London's Roehampton University on the evening of Thursday 26 June, giving young players, coaches and parents the opportunity to learn from experts in the field about issues affecting their tennis careers.

The Wimbledon Forum is one of nine educational forums that the ITF is running this year in conjunction with its regional associations around the world. Between 600 and 800 junior players will be involved in these forums, which cover topics of use to players both on- and off-court. The forums are one component of the ITF Junior Tennis School, along with an e-learning website: www.itfjunior Tennisschool.com.

This year's speakers will be Dr Stuart Miller, ITF Head of Science and Technical; Fraser Reid of the sports business lawyers Couchman Harrington; Ashley Keber, director of the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour's Pro U programme; and Sandra Harwitt, a journalist and board member of the International Tennis Writers' Association.

The Sony Ericsson WTA Tour supports the Wimbledon Forum, providing one of the key speakers and also a range of gifts for the players.

The Forum gets underway at 6.00pm with registration. Each speaker's presentation will last around 20 minutes, with time for questions. All junior players, parents and coaches are invited to attend. For more information, please contact Helen.mcfetridge@itftennis.com.

'Play and Stay' campaign marks one-year anniversary

'Tennis...Play and Stay' today marks its one-year anniversary, following its launch at the 2007 ITF AGM in Tunis. The ITF campaign aims to improve tennis for starter players by making the game easy, fun and healthy. To do this, the ITF promotes the use of slower red, orange and green balls and smaller courts that enable all kids and adults to play the game ('serve, rally and score') from the first lesson.

Players who start with standard tennis balls on full courts often leave the sport early, as it can take a long time before they are able to play the game. The slower balls give players more time and control so that they can play the game straight away, which means they are more likely to stay in the sport.

In the 365 days since the campaign launched, 55 nations, including Australia and the United States, have introduced Play and Stay programmes promoting slower balls and smaller courts. Fifty additional nations have held other forms of Play and Stay promotion.

Dave Miley, ITF Executive Director of Development, said of the anniversary: "Due to the hard work by the ITF and the National Associations, the campaign has had a very successful first year, but there is still a great deal of work to be done. The ITF is dedicated to enhancing the image and experience of tennis worldwide and, at the introductory level, this will be done by promoting the use of slower balls and smaller courts with starter players."

Maamoun stars for Touring Team to North Africa



ITF International 18 & Under Touring Team to North Africa

Karim Maamoun of Egypt starred for the ITF International 18 & Under Touring Team to North Africa that completed its four-week tour of Morocco last week. The 17-year-old reached three singles finals, winning in Rabat, and also partnered Francis Alcantara (PHI) to two doubles titles.

The tour commenced with a training camp enabling the players to acclimatise and get the feel for the courts. The first circuit event was an ITF Grade 4 tournament in Casablanca, where Alcantara and Maamoun defeated Britons Ahmed El Menshawy and Oliver Evans 63 61 in the boys' doubles final. In singles, the best performance came from Ema Burgic (BIH), who reached the girls' semifinals.

The Egyptian stepped up a level at the Grade 3 event in Rabat, winning the boys' singles with a 61 62 victory over Nat Maraga (AUS). He also teamed up with Alcantara to reach the doubles final. Channel Simmonds reached the girls' singles semifinals, before going out to eventual champion Valentina Ivakhnenko (UKR).

Maamoun narrowly failed to win a second successive title at the Grade 2 event in Mohammedia, losing the final to up-and-coming 15-year-old Carlos Boluda (ESP) 62 63. However he went on to win the doubles with Alcantara against David Sofaer (AUS) and William Paker (USA) 64 36 62.

The Egyptian avenged his defeat against Boluda in the Grade 1 tournament in Casablanca, defeating the Spaniard 64 62 in the semifinals, before losing to Miguel Almeida (POR) 62 46 62 in the final. There was also final disappointment for Duncan Mugabe (UGA) and Grant Ive (RSA) in the boys' doubles final.

Berankis looks for ITF Pro Circuit success

ITF Junior World Champion Ricardas Berankis of Lithuania has used his ITF Junior Exempt status to enter next week's Germany F9 Futures tournament which starts on 30 June. Berankis, who turned 18 last weekend, is looking to improve his current ATP Ranking of No. 551.

The Lithuanian played the USA F2 Futures earlier this year, where he advanced through qualifying to reach the semifinals. He also partnered Siarhei Betau from Belarus to victory in the doubles event at the USA F6 Futures in McAllen, Texas.

Croatia stages its second \$75,000 Women's Circuit tournament of the year in Zagreb during the week of 7 July. The tournament, which offers full hospitality to all participants, has attracted entries from seven players ranked in the WTA top 100, including Romania's Sorana-Mihaela Cristea, fresh from her run in doubles at this year's Roland Garros.

Obituaries

The ITF was saddened to learn of the death of **Sir Dennis Weatherstone** on 13 June aged 77.

Weatherstone was an active Board Member of the International Tennis Hall of Fame for many years serving on various committees. He was instrumental in funding the Hall of Fame's Information Research Centre. A leading authority on world financial markets, Weatherstone was knighted by Queen Elizabeth in 1990.

Alberto Landi, the marketing and communications director of Lotto Sport Italia, died at the weekend following a sudden and incurable illness, aged 36.

Landi headed important advertising and communication campaigns, as well as being involved in high-profile sponsorship deals.
