On court today:

- In Bologna, Sweden face Chile in the nations' 7th Davis Cup encounter. Sweden hold a dominant 5-1 lead in the head-to-head between the two teams, and were successful when they last met too, recording a convincing victory in the 2020 Qualifiers in Stockholm. But Chile will be optimistic of a victory today in Nicolas Jarry, they have the highest-ranked player in today's tie as their No. 1, and Nicolas Massu's team look to be strong in all areas this year. The Chileans are back at the Finals after a 4-year absence and will be determined to progress to Malaga this season and end a 13-year absence from the Davis Cup quarterfinals.
- In Manchester, 10-time champions France begin their campaign against a rejuvenated Switzerland team. The French will be hoping to improve on their performance in 2022, which saw the team finish in 3rd place in their group in Hamburg. Finishing in the top 2 in Group B this week would see the team return to the Davis Cup quarterfinals for the first time since 2018. For Switzerland, who are back at the highest level of Davis Cup for the first time since 2015, they will look to veteran star Stan Wawrinka a Davis Cup champion alongside Roger Federer in 2014 to guide them to Malaga this week.
- In Valencia, Viktor Troicki's Serbian team take on Korea, Rep. in a rematch of a Finals Group Stage tie from the same city in 2022. Serbia won on that occasion and will be optimistic of doing so again this year, even if Novak Djokovic is not quite ready to play yet following his historic US Open triumph on Sunday. The Koreans were competitive in Valencia last year but failed to win any of their three ties and they will be hopeful of beginning the week strongly ahead of tricky encounters with both Spain and Czechia. They will also hope to continue the momentum from their sensation victory over Belgium in February's Qualifiers, in which they recovered from 0-2 down to win 3-2 for the first time in their history.
- In Split, Finals debutants Finland will take on a strong Dutch team, with both nations aiming for a quick start before clashes with Croatia and USA later in the week. Netherlands impressed in Glasgow in 2022, winning all 3 ties they played, but fell at the first hurdle in Malaga, a narrow defeat to Australia ending their run in quarterfinals and Paul Haarhuis will hope his team can make it through to the Final 8 again this season to have another crack at the title. Finland, meanwhile, have recorded their best-ever Davis Cup result simply by reaching the Finals this year. As underdogs in all 3 ties they will play this week, they will know that they have nothing to lose and potentially be all the more dangerous for it.



Sweden - Team Information

- <u>SWEDEN</u> are bidding to reach the quarterfinals 2nd time in the last 3 years. They are making their 3rd appearance at the Davis Cup Finals.
- Last season, Sweden defeated Japan 3-2 in the Qualifiers in Helsingborg in March to advance to the Finals. The team then finished in 3rd place in Group A at the Finals after defeating Argentina 2-1 but falling to both Croatia and Italy 2-1.
- In the Qualifiers this year, Sweden defeated Bosnia and Herzegovina 3-1 in Stockholm to secure their place at the Finals.
- Sweden are **7-time Davis Cup champions**, with all 7 of their titles coming between 1975 and 1998. They are 5th on the all-time list of champions behind USA (32 titles), Australia (28), France and Great Britain (both 10).
- Sweden are ranked No. 12 in the Davis Cup Nations Ranking. Their best ranking is No. 4, which they held from December 2001 to July 2002.



He won 2 of the 3 singles matches he played at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals defeating Argentina's Sebastian Baez and Croatia's Borna Gojo before falling to Italy's Matteo Berrettini. He then won his singles match during Sweden's 3-1 victory over Bosnia and Herzegovina in the Qualifiers this year, defeating Damir Dzumhur in singles, before partnering Goransson in doubles, falling to Mirza Basic/Tomislav Brkic.



He is the son of 1975 Davis Cup champion, 11-time Grand Slam champion and former world No. 1 Bjorn Borg.

 Italy's Bolelli/Fognini alongside Dragos Madaras. Goransson also partnered Elias Ymer in a loss to
 Bosnia and Herzegovina's Basic/Brkic in the Qualifiers this year.

Chile - Team Information

- CHILE are bidding to reach the quarterfinals for the first time since 2010. This is their 2nd appearance at the Davis Cup Finals and first since in 2019.
- Last season, Chile defeated Slovenia 4-0 in the World Group I Play-Offs in Vina del Mar in March before defeating Peru 3-2 in a World Group I tie in Lima in September.
- In the Qualifiers this year, Chile defeated Kazakhstan 3-1 in La Serena in February to secure their place at the Finals. Nicolas Jarry and Christian Garin both defeated Alexander Bublik in singles, and Marcelo Tomas Barrios Vera/Alejandro Tabilo defeated Andrey Golubev/Aleksandr Nedovyesov in doubles.
- Chile's **best Davis Cup performance** is finishing runners-up in 1976. They lost to Italy 4-1 in the final in Santiago.
- Chile are currently ranked No. 17 on the Davis Cup Nations Ranking. They reached their highest-ever ranking of No. 10 in April 2006.

He has won 18 of the 31 Davis Cup matches he has contested since making his debut in 2013.

- Davis Cup: Garin made his Davis Cup debut at the age of 16 in 2012 and has competed in a total of 18 ties since then. He won the 4th match in Chile's 3-1 victory against Kazakhstan in the Qualifiers this year, defeating Bublik in 3 sets. He won one of the 2 matches he contested during Chile's only previous Davis Cup Finals appearance in 2019, defeating Germany's Jan-Lennard Struff but falling to Argentina's Diego Schwartzman.



A 14th Davis Cup meeting for France and Switzerland and first since the 2014 final. France leads the head-to-head 10-3, with the 2 nations meeting for the first time 100 years ago in 1923 in Lyon, the first year Switzerland competed in the competition. France won the first 8 meetings between the 2 nations from 1923 to 1988, before Switzerland claimed their first victory over France in 1992. After those 8 straight defeats, Switzerland have won 3 of the last 5 meetings, including defeating France in the 2014 final to claim their first and only Davis Cup title to date.

France - Team Information

EDANCE

- **FRANCE** are bidding to reach the quarterfinals for the first time since 2018. They are making their 4th appearance at the Davis Cup Finals.
- Last season, France defeated Ecuador 4-0 in the Qualifiers in Pau to secure their place at the Finals..They finished in 3rd place in Group C after defeating Belgium 2-1 but falling to Germany and Australia 2-1, failing to reach the quarterfinals for a 3rd consecutive season. Prior to 2019, when they also fell in the group stages, they had reached the quarterfinals or better in every Davis Cup season since 2009.
- In the Qualifiers this year, France defeated Hungary 3-2 in Tatabanya to secure their place at the Finals. They recovered from 1-2 down with singles wins from Adrian Mannarino and Ugo Humbert on the 2nd day of play.
- France have won the Davis Cup title on 10 previous occasions most recently in 2017, when they defeated Belgium in Lille. They have finished runner-up on 9 occasions, including in 2014 (I. Switzerland) and 2018 (I. Croatia).
- France are bidding to win their 11th Davis Cup title this year and claim sole ownership of **3rd place on the list for most Davis Cup titles**, ahead of Great Britain. They equalled Great Britain in 3rd place on the list after winning their 10th title in 2017.
- France are currently ranked No. 11 on the **Davis Cup Nations Ranking**. They are one of 9 nations to have held the No. 1 ranking (alongside Argentina, Australia, Croatia, Czechia, Great Britain, Russia, Spain and Canada) they were ranked No. 1 in 2002-03, again in 2004 and most recently from November 2017 to December 2021.





He and Rinderknech then fell to Australia's Matthew Ebden/Max Purcell before defeating Belgium's Sander Gille/Joran Vliegen. In the Qualifiers this year, he and Rinderknech lost to Hungary's Fabian Marozsan/Mate Valkusz in the 3rd match of France's 3-2 victory over Hungary. He was a member of the French team which finished as runners-up to Croatia in 2018, partnering Pierre-Hugues Herbert to victory against Ivan Dodig/Mate Pavic in the doubles match.



- <u>SERBIA</u> are bidding to reach the quarterfinals for the 3rd time in the last 4 seasons. They are making their 4th appearance at the Davis Cup Finals.
- Last season, Serbia gained entry to the Finals via a wild card. They finished in 3rd place in Group B after winning 2 of their 3 ties they defeated Canada and Korea, Rep. 2-1 after falling to Spain 3-0.
- In the Qualifiers this year, Serbia defeated Norway 4-0 in Oslo to secure their place at the Finals. Laslo Djere and Miomir Kecmanovic secured singles wins before Nikola Cacic and Filip Krajinovic sealed the tie with a doubles win.
- Serbia won their only Davis Cup title to date in 2010, defeating France 3-2 having trailed 2-1 going into the final day. They also finished as runners-up in 2013, falling to Czechia in the final.

- <u>FINLAND</u> are bidding to reach the quarterfinals for the first time. They are making their first appearance at the Davis Cup Finals.
- Last season, Finland fell to Belgium 3-2 in the Qualifiers in Espoo in March, before defeating New Zealand 5-0 in a World Group I tie in Espoo in September.
- In the Qualifiers this year, Finland defeated Argentina 3-1 in Espoo. Emil Ruusuvuori won both of his singles matches defeating both Pedro Cachin and Facundo Bagnis in straight sets partnered Harri Heliovaara to victory against Maximo Gonzalez/Andres Molteni in doubles.
- Prior to reaching the Finals this year, Finland's **best Davis Cup performance** is reaching the World Group play-offs on 3 occasions. They lost on all 3 occasions to Sweden in 1990, Italy in 1999 and Netherlands in 2002. They fell to Italy in World Group play-off ties in 1981 and 1987.
- Finland are currently ranked at No. 21 on the **Davis Cup Nations Ranking**, their best position since the rankings were introduced in 2001.





In the Qualifiers this year, Heliovaara and Ruusuvuori defeated Gonzalez/Molteni in the 3rd match of Finland's 3-1 victory over Argentina. Heliovaara will equal Leo Palin in 5th place on the list for most Davis Cup match-wins by a Finnish player if he wins one match this week, will claim sole ownership of 5th place if he wins 2 matches and will equal Henri Kontinen in 4th place on the list if he wins 3 matches.
