On court today...

- No. 3 seed Carlos Alcaraz takes on No. 16 seed Ugo Humbert first up on Centre Court today as he looks to reach consecutive quarterfinals here at Wimbledon. If he wins and reaches the last 8 at a major for the 9th time, he will draw level with his coach Juan Carlos Ferrero in joint-3rd place on the list for most Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances by a Spanish man in the Open Era. He will also become the 5th Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions, after Rafael Nadal, Feliciano Lopez, David Ferrer and Ferrero. Meanwhile, Humbert is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time, having reached the last 16 at a major for just the 2nd time in his career – his only other appearance in the last 16 at a Grand Slam came on his Wimbledon debut in 2019, when he fell to world No. 1 and eventual champion Novak Djokovic.
- On No. 1 Court today, world No. 1 Jannik Sinner takes on Ben Shelton, with the American bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time on just his 2nd Wimbledon appearance. By reaching the round of 16 here this year, Shelton has emulated his father and coach, Bryan, who reached the same stage of the men's singles here 30 years ago. If he hopes to go one better than his father, Shelton will have to dig deep to find the energy to do so, having played 3 five-set matches and spent more than 10 hours on court in the opening 3 rounds here to make it to the last 16. By contrast, Sinner has spent just over 8 hours on court across 11 sets in his 3 matches so far. The Italian won in straight sets on the pair's only previous meeting in 2024, in the round of 16 at Indian Wells-1000 in March.

A 4th meeting for Sinner and Shelton, but their first at a Grand Slam or on grass. It is their 2nd meeting this season, with Sinner having won in straight sets in the round of 16 at Indian Wells-1000 in March.

Sinner won his only previous match against a lefthanded player at Wimbledon, against Juan Manuel Cerundolo in the 1st round last year. He has a 2-3 win-loss record against lefthanded players at the Grand Slams overall.

Since the beginning of the 2023 season, Sinner has won 7 of the 8 matches he has contested against lefthanded players at Tour-level, with his only defeat to a lefthanded player in that time coming against Shelton in the round of 16 at Shanghai-1000 last year. He has a 16-7 win-loss record against lefthanded players at Tour-level overall.

Shelton lost his only previous match against a world No. 1, against Carlos Alcaraz in the 3rd round at 2023 Toronto-1000. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Tour-level is No. 4 Sinner in the round of 16 at 2023 Shanghai-1000. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at a Grand Slam is No. 10 Frances Tiafoe in the quarterfinals at the 2023 US Open.

- **SINNER** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 3rd straight year. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 19th Grand Slam overall.
- Sinner is bidding to become the **first Italian man in history to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon on 3 occasions**. He is one of 6 Italian men in history to reach the quarterfinals here – alongside Umberto de Morpurgo (1928), Nicola Pietrangeli (1955, 1960), Adriano Panatta (1979), Davide Sanguinetti (1998) and Matteo Berrettini (2021).
- Sinner is bidding to reach his 8th Grand Slam quarterfinal. By reaching his 7th Grand Slam quarterfinal at Roland Garros this year, he claimed sole ownership of **2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances by an Italian man**. (see table overleaf)

- If Sinner and Lorenzo Musetti both reach the quarterfinals here, it will be the **first time in history that multiple Italian men have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon**. It will be the 7th time that multiple Italian men have reached the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam – after Roland Garros in 1948 (Giovanni Cucelli and Marcello del Bello), 1956 (Giuseppe Merlo and Pietrangeli), 1960 (Pietrangeli and Orlando Sirola) and 1973 (Paolo Bertolucci and Panatta), and the 2022 Australian Open (Berrettini and Sinner) and 2022 US Open (Berrettini and Sinner).
- Wimbledon is Sinner's **3rd-most successful Grand Slam event in terms of matches won**, and his joint-most successful Grand Slam event in terms of quarterfinals reached, alongside the Australian Open and Roland Garros.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Sinner has become the **3rd Italian man in history to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on 3 or more occasions** – after Pietrangeli (1955-56, 1958, 1960, 1965) and Berrettini (2019, 2021, 2023).
- Sinner is through to the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 13th time. He is in **2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by an Italian man** – behind Pietrangeli (16 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances).
- With Sinner and Musetti both reaching the round of 16 here this year, it is the **4th time in history that multiple Italian men have reached the last 16 at Wimbledon** – after 1949 (Giovanni Cucelli and Rolando del Bello), 1955 (Giuseppe Merlo and Pietrangeli) and 2021 (Berrettini and Lorenzo Sonego).
- Last year here, Sinner recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the semifinals (I. Novak Djokovic). It was his first appearance in a Grand Slam semifinal, having previously reached the quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments, including at Wimbledon in 2022 (I. Djokovic).
- Sinner won his **first Grand Slam title** at the 2024 Australian Open, recovering from 0-2 down to defeat Daniil Medvedev in 5 sets in the final. He became the 3rd Italian man to win a Grand Slam title – after Nicola Pietrangeli (1959, 1960 Roland Garros) and Adriano Panatta (1976 Roland Garros) – and the first Italian player to win an Australian Open singles title.
- Sinner is bidding to become the **2nd Italian player to win multiple Grand Slam singles titles**, after Pietrangeli. He is also bidding to become the first Italian player to win a Wimbledon singles title and the 2nd Italian player to reach a singles final here, after 2021 men's singles runner-up Berrettini.
- Sinner is bidding to become the **6th active player to win multiple Grand Slam men's singles titles** – after Alcaraz, Djokovic, Andy Murray, Rafael Nadal and Stan Wawrinka. He would also become the 32nd player in the Open Era to win multiple Grand Slam men's singles titles.
- If Sinner wins his 2nd Grand Slam title on his 2nd Grand Slam appearance since winning his first, he will equal the **Open Era record for fewest attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam men's singles title**. In the Open Era, 7 players have won their 2nd Grand Slam singles titles on their 2nd appearances after winning their first – Alcaraz, Sergi Bruguera, Roger Federer, Jan Kodes, Murray, Stan Smith and Guillermo Vilas. No player has won their 2nd Grand Slam men's singles title on their first Grand Slam appearance after winning their first.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Sinner reached the semifinals at Roland Garros for the first time, falling to Carlos Alcaraz in 5 sets.

- Sinner is bidding to record his **54th Grand Slam match-win**. By defeating Grigor Dimitrov in the quarterfinals at Roland Garros last month for his 50th Grand Slam match-win, he became the 5th Italian man in history to record 50 match-wins at the Grand Slams – after Pietrangeli (94 Grand Slam match-wins), Fabio Fognini (71), Andreas Seppi (63) and Panatta (62).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Sinner won his **first grass court title** at Halle (d. Hubert Hurkacz). He became the 4th Italian man in history to win a Tour-level title on grass – after Berrettini (4 grass court titles), and Andreas Seppi and Lorenzo Sonego (both one).
- Sinner has won 4 Tour-level titles this season and leads the Tour for **most singles titles won in 2024**. In addition to his titles at the Australian Open and Halle, he also won the titles at Rotterdam (d. Alex de Minaur) and Miami-1000 (d. Grigor Dimitrov). He also reached the semifinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Alcaraz) and Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas) and the quarterfinals at Madrid-1000, where he gave a walkover to Felix Auger-Aliassime due to a right hip injury.
- Sinner is bidding to record his 42nd Tour-level match-win this season. He is in **first place on the list for most Tour-level matches won in 2024** – ahead of Casper Ruud (who has a 40-10 win-loss record in 2024) and Alexander Zverev (40-11).
- Sinner has won one of the last 5 **five-set matches** he has contested, with his only victory in a 5-set match in that time coming against Medvedev in the final at the Australian Open this year. He lost the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon – in the quarterfinals in 2022, when he lost to Djokovic in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead. He has a 6-8 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Sinner became the **first Italian player to reach the singles world No. 1 ranking** last month and plays here at the same ranking. By winning the title at Halle, he became the 8th man to win the title in his first event as world No. 1 since the ATP rankings were introduced in 1973. He is guaranteed to remain at No. 1 the week on Monday 15 July regardless of the outcome of this tournament.
- Sinner reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 133** and did not contest the boys' singles events at any of the Grand Slam tournaments. His best result as a junior was reaching the quarterfinals as a wild card at the Grade A Trofeo Bonfiglio event in Milan in 2018 (l. Naoki Tajima).
- Sinner **led Italy to their 2nd Davis Cup title in 2023**, winning all 5 matches he played across singles and doubles at the Final 8 Knockout Stage in Malaga. He made his Davis Cup debut in 2021 and has an 11-4 overall win-loss record in the competition. As defending champions, Italy qualified automatically for the 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage in September and will compete in Group A in Bologna alongside Netherlands, Belgium and Brazil.
- Sinner is coached by Simone Vagnozzi and Darren Cahill.
- Lefthander **SHELTON** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and his 8th Grand Slam overall.
- Shelton is bidding to become the **48th American man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – and the 3rd active American man to do so, after Christopher Eubanks and Taylor Fritz. (NB Tommy Paul is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time)
- Aged 21 years 279 days, Shelton is bidding to reach his 3rd Grand Slam quarterfinal and become the **30th man in the Open Era to reach 3 or more Grand Slam quarterfinals aged 21 or under**. He would also become the 9th American man in the Open Era to reach 3 Grand Slam quarterfinals aged 21 or under – after Andre Agassi, Michael Chang, Jimmy Connors, Jim Courier, Tim Mayotte, John McEnroe, Andy Roddick and Pete Sampras. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- If at least 2 of Shelton, Fritz and Paul all reach the quarterfinals here, it will be the **first time that multiple American men have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon since 2000** – when Agassi, Sampras and Jan-Michael Gambill all reached the quarterfinals here. Multiple American men have reached the quarterfinals at 2 of the last 6 Grand Slam tournaments – at the 2023 Australian Open (Shelton, Paul and Sebastian Korda) and the 2023 US Open (Shelton, Fritz and Frances Tiafoe).
- Shelton is bidding to become the **youngest American man to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon since 2003**, when Roddick reached the quarterfinals here aged 20 years 310 days. He would become the 13th American man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon aged 21 or under.

- Wimbledon is Shelton's **3rd-most successful Grand Slam event in terms of matches won**, behind the Australian Open and the US Open.

- If he wins today's match in 5 sets, Shelton will become the **first player in the Open Era to win 4 consecutive five-set matches at a Grand Slam tournament**. In the Open Era, 4 players have won 4 five-set matches at the same Grand Slam tournament – but none have won them consecutively.

- By winning his opening 3 matches here in 5 sets, Shelton has become the **6th player in the Open Era to win 3 consecutive five-set matches in the opening 3 rounds at Wimbledon**. He is also the 9th player in the Open Era to win 3 consecutive five-set matches here across all stages of the tournament and the 15th player in the Open Era to contest 3 five-set matches (consecutive or non-consecutive).
- By winning his opening 3 matches here in 5 sets, Shelton has become the **2nd player to win 3 consecutive five-set matches at a Grand Slam in 2024** – after Adrian Mannarino, who won his opening 3 matches at the Australian Open in 5 sets before falling to Novak Djokovic in the round of 16.
- Shelton has **won all 4 five-set matches he has contested at Wimbledon**. In addition to his 3 five-set victories here this year, he also defeated Taro Daniel in 5 sets in the 1st round on his Wimbledon debut last year. He has a 6-2 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- By reaching the round of 16 here 30 years after his father, Bryan, reached the last 16, the Sheltons have become the **11th parent-child combination to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon**. They have become the 7th father-son combination to reach the round of 16 here – after Einer and Jørgen Ulrich, Einer and Torben Ulrich, Tony and Buster Mottram, Ramanathan and Ramesh Krishnan, Phil and Taylor Dent, and Petr and Sebastian Korda.

- By winning his opening 3 matches here in 5 sets, Shelton has become the **2nd player to win 3 consecutive five-set matches at a Grand Slam in 2024** – after Adrian Mannarino, who won his opening 3 matches at the Australian Open in 5 sets before falling to Novak Djokovic in the round of 16.
- Shelton has **won all 4 five-set matches he has contested at Wimbledon**. In addition to his 3 five-set victories here this year, he also defeated Taro Daniel in 5 sets in the 1st round on his Wimbledon debut last year. He has a 6-2 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Shelton has become **87th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – and the 10th active American player to do so, after Eubanks, Fritz, Korda, Denis Kudla, Mackenzie McDonald, Brandon Nakashima, Paul, Tennys Sandgren and Tiafoe.
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Shelton has recorded his **best Wimbledon result**. Last year here, on his Wimbledon debut, he reached the 2nd round (d. Taro Daniel, I. Laslo Djere).
- Shelton's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals at the 2023 US Open (I. Novak Djokovic). Aged 20 years 336 days, he became the youngest American man to reach the semifinals at the US Open since Michael Chang (20 years 204 days) in 1992.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Shelton reached the 3rd round at both the Australian Open (I. Adrian Mannarino) and Roland Garros (I. Felix Auger-Aliassime).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Shelton reached the quarterfinals at Mallorca, where he received a bye through the 1st round and defeated Rinky Hijikata before falling to Paul Jubb. He lost his opening match at both Stuttgart (I. James Duckworth) and Queen's (I. Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard).
- Shelton's best result in 2024 is winning his **2nd Tour-level title** at Houston (d. Frances Tiafoe). He also reached the semifinals at Auckland (I. Taro Daniel) and Dallas (I. Tommy Paul) and the quarterfinals at Acapulco (I. Casper Ruud).
- Shelton is bidding to record his **7th match-win on grass, at any level**. In addition to his 3 victories here this year, his 2nd round finish here last year, and his victory against Hijikata at Mallorca last week, his only other match-win on grass came in a 2nd round finish at 2023 Queen's (d. JJ Wolf, I. Lorenzo Musetti).
- Shelton reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 14 in April this year after winning his 2nd Tour-level title at Houston. He plays here at the same ranking.
- Shelton is one of **3 seeded American men** to reach the round of 16 here from the 5 who began the main draw. USA has more seeded players in the draw than any other nation.
- Shelton **played college tennis**. He represented the University of Florida for 2 seasons, compiling a 65-10 win-loss record in singles and winning the 2021 NCAA team title and the 2022 NCAA singles title.
- Shelton **contested just 4 tournaments as a junior player**, all of which came in his home country. His best result was reaching the 3rd round as a wild card at 2020 JA Plantation (USA) (also known as the Orange Bowl), falling to Jack Pinnington Jones.
- Shelton's father, Bryan Shelton, reached a career-high ranking of No. 55 in March 1992. He made 6 appearances at Wimbledon, reaching the round of 16 in 1994.
- Shelton is coached by his father, Bryan Shelton, and Dean Goldfine.

- Defending champion **ALCARAZ** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 14th Grand Slam overall.
- Alcaraz is bidding to become the **5th Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Rafael Nadal (8 Wimbledon quarterfinal appearances), Feliciano Lopez (3), David Ferrer and Juan Carlos Ferrero (both 2). - Wimbledon is Alcaraz's **3rd most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of matches won and quarterfinals reached.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Alcaraz has become the **7th Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on 3 or more occasions** – after Nadal (10 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances), Lopez (6), Bautista Agut, Ferrer and Fernando Verdasco (all 5) and Ferrero (4). (NB Bautista Agut is also competing in the round of 16 here today)
- By reaching the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 10th time, Alcaraz has also become the **11th Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the last 16 at the Grand Slams on 10 or more occasions** – after Nadal (54 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), Ferrer (27), Tommy Robredo (23), Verdasco (18), Ferrero (15), Bautista Agut (14), Carlos Moya and Manuel Orantes (both 13), Lopez (12) and Emilio Sanchez (11).
- Last year here, Alcaraz won his **first Wimbledon title**, defeating Novak Djokovic in 5 sets in the final. He became the 3rd Spanish man to win the title here – after Manuel Santana (1966) and Rafael Nadal (2008, 2010) – and, aged 20 years 72 days, became the 3rd-youngest player in the Open Era to win the men's singles title here, after Boris Becker (who won his first 2 Wimbledon titles aged 17 years 227 days in 1985 and aged 18 years 226 days in 1986) and Bjorn Borg (who won his first Wimbledon title aged 20 years 27 days in 1976).
- Alcaraz has **won 3 Grand Slam titles on 3 different surfaces**. He won his first Grand Slam title at the 2022 US Open (d. Casper Ruud) and won his most-recent Grand Slam title at 2024 Roland Garros (d. Alexander Zverev). He became the first man in the Open Era to win his first 3 Grand Slam titles on different surfaces and, aged 21 years 36 days, became the youngest man in the Open Era to win 3 Grand Slam titles on different surfaces.
- Alcaraz is bidding to become the **9th man in the Open Era to retain the Wimbledon title** – after Rod Laver, John Newcombe, Borg, John McEnroe, Becker, Pete Sampras, Roger Federer and Djokovic.
- Alcaraz is bidding to become the **3rd player in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon men's singles titles aged 21 or under** – after Becker and Borg.
- Alcaraz is also bidding to win his **4th Grand Slam title and equal the Open Era record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles won aged 21 or under** – alongside Becker, Borg and Mats Wilander.
- Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Alcaraz reached the quarterfinals at the Australian Open (l. Zverev).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Alcaraz reached the 2nd round as defending champion at Queen's (d. Francisco Cerundolo, l. Jack Draper). The defeat to Draper ended Alcaraz's 13-match winning streak on grass, with his last defeat on grass having come in the round of 16 at 2022 Wimbledon, when he fell to Jannik Sinner.
- Alcaraz's **other highlights in 2024** are winning the title at Indian Wells-1000 (d. Medvedev) and reaching the semifinals at Buenos Aires (l. Nicolas Jarry) and the quarterfinals at Miami-1000 (l. Grigor Dimitrov) and Madrid-1000 (l. Andrey Rublev). He is one of 10 players to have won multiple Tour-level titles prior to Wimbledon this season.

- Alcaraz has won 12 of the 13 **five-set matches** he has contested, including his 5-set win over Tiafoe in the 3rd round here this year. His only defeat in a 5-set match came against Matteo Berrettini in the 3rd round at the 2022 Australian Open. He became the first man in the Open Era to win the Roland Garros title after winning 5-set matches in both the semifinals and the final, defeating Sinner in the semifinals before defeating Zverev in the final. He has won all 3 five-set matches he has contested at Wimbledon.
- Aged 19 years 130 days, Alcaraz became the **youngest world No. 1 in history** after winning the title at the 2022 US Open. He has been ranked as world No. 1 for 36 weeks, most recently between June and September 2023. He plays here at No. 3.
- Alcaraz **led Spain to victory at the 2018 Junior Davis Cup Finals in Budapest**, defeating France in the title match. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 22 in January 2020 and his best performance in the junior events at the Grand Slams was his quarterfinal finish in the boys' singles here in 2019.
- Alcaraz has played **Davis Cup** for Spain since 2022 and has won 2 of the 3 matches he has contested in the competition. Spain were awarded a wild card for the 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage and will compete in Group B in Valencia alongside Australia, Czechia and France.
- Alcaraz is coached by former world No. 1 Juan Carlos Ferrero, who reached the quarterfinals here in 2007 and 2009.
- Lefthander **HUMBERT** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and his 23rd Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Humbert is bidding to become the **12th Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after Cedric Pioline and Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (4 quarterfinal appearances here), Guy Forget, Sebastian Grosjean and Henri Leconte (all 3), Richard Gasquet (2) and Thierry Champion, Arnaud Clement, Nicolas Escude, Lucas Pouille and Gilles Simon (all one). (NB Arthur Fils and Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard are also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time)
- Humbert is bidding to become the **22nd Frenchman in the Open Era** to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam. (NB Fils and Mpetshi Perricard are also bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time here)
- If Humbert, Fils and Mpetshi Perricard all reach the quarterfinals here, it will be the **first time in the Open Era that 3 Frenchmen have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon**. If at least 2 Frenchmen reach the quarterfinals here this year, it will be the 4th time in the Open Era that multiple Frenchmen have reached the quarterfinals here – after 1991 (when Champion and Forget reached the quarterfinals), 2015 (Gasquet and Simon) and 2016 (Pouille and Tsonga).
- Wimbledon is Humbert's **most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of matches won.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Humbert has become the **12th Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Gasquet (7 round of 16 appearances here), Tsonga (6), Forget, Leconte and Pioline (all 5), Grosjean (4), Clement, Adrian Panatta and Simon (all 3) and Paul-Henri Mathieu and Benoit Paire (both 2).
- Last year here**, Humbert fell to Jason Kubler in 5 sets in the 1st round.
- Humbert's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions, both at Wimbledon – this year, and on his Wimbledon debut in 2019. He defeated Gael Monfils, Marcel Granollers and Felix Auger-Aliassime before falling to Novak Djokovic in the last 16.
- In Grand Slam play this year**, Humbert reached the 3rd round at the Australian Open (l. Hubert Hurkacz) but lost in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Lorenzo Sonego).
- Prior to Wimbledon this season**, Humbert reached the semifinals at 's-Hertogenbosch, defeating Fils and Gijs Brouwer before falling to Alex de Minaur. He fell in the 1st round at Queen's (l. Matteo Araldi) and also lost his opening match at Mallorca (l. Roberto Bautista Agut).

- Humbert's best results in 2024 are **winning his 5th and 6th Tour-level titles** – at Marseille (d. Grigor Dimitrov) and Dubai (d. Alexander Bublik). He is one of 10 players to have won multiple Tour-level titles in 2024. He also reached quarterfinals at Doha (l. Monfils) and Monte-Carlo-1000 (l. Casper Ruud).
- Humbert has **won one Tour-level title on grass** – at Halle in 2021 (d. Andrey Rublev). He is one of 24 players competing here this year to have won at least one Tour-level title on grass. His 5 other Tour-level titles have all come on hard courts.
- Humbert has **won all 6 Tour-level finals he has contested**. By winning the titles at Marseille and Dubai this season, he became the 3rd player to win his first 6 Tour-level finals, alongside Ernests Gulbis and Martin Klizan.
- Humbert is one of the **2 lefthanders** to reach the round of 16 here from the 17 who began this year's Wimbledon men's singles main draw. In the Open Era, 5 lefthanded players have won the men's singles title here, most recently Rafael Nadal in 2010.
- Humbert is bidding to defeat a **Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the first time on his 2nd attempt**. He lost his only previous meeting with a Top 5 player at the Grand Slams, to No. 1 Djokovic in the round of 16 here in 2021. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at a Grand Slam is No. 6 Casper Ruud in the 2nd round at 2022 Wimbledon. He has a 4-3 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.
- Humbert's 5-set victory over Alexander Shevchenko in the 1st round here this year was his **3rd victory in a 5-set match** – he has a 3-8 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall, with all 3 of his victories coming at Wimbledon. He has a 3-2 win-loss record in 5-set matches here.
- Humbert reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 13 in April this year. He plays here 3 places lower at No. 16.
- Humbert reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 18** in January 2016 but never competed in the boys' singles event at Wimbledon.
- Humbert made his **Davis Cup** debut for France against Hungary in the 2023 Qualifiers, and has a 4-1 win-loss record in the competition. France will compete in Valencia alongside Australia, Czechia and Spain in Group B at the 2024 Davis Cup Finals.
- Humbert is coached by Jeremy Chardy, who reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon in 2014.

An 11th meeting for Medvedev and Dimitrov, and their 2nd at a Grand Slam and 2nd on grass. The pair's first meeting came on grass, with Dimitrov winning in the quarterfinals at 2017 Queen's, but their subsequent 9 matches have been played on hard courts. Medvedev won their only previous Grand Slam meeting, in the semifinals at the 2019 US Open.

This is the first meeting between Top 10 players at Wimbledon this year. Medvedev has a 1-1 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Wimbledon, a 10-9 win-loss record against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams and a 44-44 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level overall. Dimitrov has a 2-3 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Wimbledon, a 5-15 win-loss record against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams and a 42-88 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level overall.

Medvedev and Dimitrov are both bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time. The winner of today's match will become the 12th active player to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions – after Novak Djokovic (14 Wimbledon quarterfinal appearances), Andy Murray (10), Rafael Nadal (8), Marin Cilic and Milos Raonic (both 4) and Richard Gasquet, David Goffin, Nick Kyrgios, Kei Nishikori, Jannik Sinner and Stan Wawrinka (all 2). (NB Roberto Bautista Agut is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time)

Medvedev and Dimitrov are 2 of the 13 active players to have reached the men's singles quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam events – alongside Carlos Alcaraz, Matteo Berrettini, Cilic, Djokovic, Karen Khachanov, Murray, Nadal, Nishikori, Rublev, Sinner and Wawrinka.

- **MEDVEDEV** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time. This is his 6th Wimbledon appearance and his 29th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Medvedev is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the 10th time and become the **11th active player to reach 10 or more Grand Slam quarterfinals** – after Novak Djokovic (59 Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances), Rafael Nadal (47), Andy Murray (30), Stan Wawrinka (18), Marin Cilic (14), Kei Nishikori and Alexander Zverev (both 12), and Gael Monfils, Milos Raonic and Andrey Rublev (all 10).
- Wimbledon is Medvedev's **3rd-most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of matches-won, behind the US Open and the Australian Open.

- Last year here, Medvedev recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the semifinals (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Medvedev won his **first Grand Slam title** at the 2021 US Open, defeating Novak Djokovic in straight sets and ending both Djokovic's bid for the Grand Slam and his 27-match Grand Slam winning streak.
- Medvedev reached his **6th Grand Slam final** at the Australian Open this year, falling to Jannik Sinner in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead. He has a 1-5 win-loss record in Grand Slam finals, having also finished runner-up at the US Open in 2019 (l. Rafael Nadal) and 2023 (l. Djokovic) and at the Australian Open in 2021 (l. Djokovic) and 2022 (l. Nadal).
- If Medvedev wins his 2nd major title here on his 10th Grand Slam appearance since winning his first, he will go **4th on the Open Era list for most attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam men's singles title** – behind Marat Safin (14 attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam title) and Djokovic and Gustavo Kuerten (both 12).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Medvedev reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros (l. Alex de Minaur).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Medvedev reached the 2nd round at Halle (d. Nuno Borges, l. Zhang Zhizhen).
- Medvedev's **best results in 2024** are runner-up finishes at the Australian Open and Indian Wells-1000 (l. Alcaraz). He also reached the semifinals at Dubai (l. Ugo Humbert) and Miami-1000 (l. Sinner) and the quarterfinals at Madrid-1000, where he retired against Jiri Lehecka due to a right hip injury.
- Medvedev has **won one Tour-level grass court title** – at 2021 Mallorca (d. Sam Querrey). Of his 19 other Tour-level titles, 18 have come on hard courts, with his only clay court title to date coming at Rome-1000 this year. His 20 titles have been won at 20 different events, which is a Tour-level record.
- Medvedev has won 4 of the last 5 **five-set matches** he has contested, with his only defeat in a 5-set match in that time coming in his most-recent 5-set match, against Sinner in the final at the Australian Open. Having won 3 five-set matches en route to the final at the Australian Open this year, he became the 12th man in the Open Era to contest 4 five-set matches at a single Grand Slam tournament. He has a 2-4 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Wimbledon and a 7-10 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Medvedev **became world No. 1** on 28 February 2022, becoming the first player other than the 'Big 4' (Djokovic, Roger Federer, Andy Murray and Rafael Nadal) to hold the top ranking since Andy Roddick in February 2004. He held the No. 1 ranking for 16 weeks during 2022 but is yet to return to the No. 1 ranking. He plays here at No. 5.
- Medvedev reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 13 in January 2014. His best performance in the boys' singles here was reaching the 2nd round in 2013 (d. Hong Seong Chan, l. Nikola Milojevic).
- Medvedev is coached by Gilles Cervara.

- **DIMITROV** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time -and the first time since 2014. This is his 14th Wimbledon appearance and his 55th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Dimitrov is bidding to become the **3rd Bulgarian player to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Katerina Maleeva (who reached the women’s singles quarterfinals here in 1990 and 1992) and Tsvetana Pironkova (2010 and 2011).
- Dimitrov is bidding to reach his **8th Grand Slam quarterfinal** and equal Manuela Maleeva’s all-time record for most Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances by a Bulgarian player. Manuela Maleeva reached 8 Grand Slam quarterfinals while representing Bulgaria. Dimitrov equalled Katerina Maleeva in 2nd place on the list by reaching his 7th Grand Slam quarterfinal at Roland Garros this year. He is the only Bulgarian man in history to have reached a Grand Slam quarterfinal
- Dimitrov is bidding to record his 23rd Wimbledon singles match-win. By defeating Gael Monfils in the 3rd round here for his 22nd Wimbledon match-win, he claimed sole ownership of the **all-time record for most Wimbledon match-wins by a Bulgarian player**, ahead of Magdalena Maleeva.
- Wimbledon is Dimitrov’s **2nd-most successful Grand Slam event in terms of matches won**. The Australian Open is his most successful Grand Slam event in terms of matches won and quarterfinals reached.

- **Last year here**, Dimitrov reached the round of 16 (l. Holger Rune). He had previously not reached the round of 16 here since 2017, when he fell to Roger Federer in the last 16.
- Dimitrov’s **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 3 occasions – including once at Wimbledon, in 2014 (l. Novak Djokovic). He also reached the semifinals at the 2017 Australian Open (l. Rafael Nadal) and the 2019 US Open (l. Daniil Medvedev).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Dimitrov reached the quarterfinals at Roland Garros (l. Jannik Sinner) but fell in the 3rd round at the Australian Open (l. Nuno Borges). By reaching the quarterfinals at Roland Garros for the first time on his 14th attempt, he set the Open Era record for most Roland Garros men’s singles appearances before reaching the quarterfinals. He also became the 54th player in the Open Era – and the 13th active player – to reach the men’s singles quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments.
- Dimitrov is contesting **54th consecutive Grand Slam tournament** here this year, putting him in joint-6th place on the all-time list for most consecutive appearances in the men’s singles at the Grand Slams, alongside Stefan Edberg. He owns the longest active streak of Grand Slam appearances, having contested the main draw at every Grand Slam tournament since the 2011 Australian Open.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Dimitrov reached the 2nd round at Queen’s (d. Adrian Mannarino, l. Sebastian Korda).
- Dimitrov’s best result in 2024 is winning his **9th Tour-level title** – and his first since the 2017 ATP Finals – at Brisbane (d. Rune). He also finished runner-up at both Marseille (l. Ugo Humbert) and Miami-1000 (l. Sinner) and reached the semifinals at Rotterdam (l. Alex de Minaur).
- Dimitrov’s **best grass court performance** is winning the title at 2014 Queen’s (d. Feliciano Lopez).
- Dimitrov’s 5-set victory against Shang Juncheng in the 2nd round here was his **2nd successful comeback from 0-2 down**. He also recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Alex Molcan in the 1st round at the US Open last year.
- Dimitrov has won 2 of the 4 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – defeating Alexandr Dolgoplov in the 3rd round here in 2014 and Shang in the 2nd round here this year, but losing to Grega Zemlja in the 2nd round in 2013 and to Moutet in the 1st round in 2019. He has a 12-9 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Dimitrov reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 after winning the title at the 2017 ATP Finals (d. David Goffin). He returned to the Top 10 for the first time since November 2018 in April this year and plays here at No. 10.

- Dimitrov was part of the ITF 14 & Under European Team in Europe in 2004-05 and the ITF 16 & Under European A Team in Europe in 2006, funded by the Grand Slam Player Development Programme (formerly known as the Grand Slam Development Fund).
- Dimitrov is coached by Daniel Vallverdu and Jamie Delgado.

Bautista Agut won their first 3 meetings – all of which came at Masters-1000 level in 2021 – by the same score, but Paul has won their 2 most recent meetings, including their only previous meeting at the majors, in the round of 16 at the 2023 Australian Open.

- **PAUL** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 20th Grand Slam overall.
- Paul is bidding to become the **48th American man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – and the 3rd active American man to do so, after Christopher Eubanks and Taylor Fritz. (NB Ben Shelton is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time)
- If at least 2 of Paul, Taylor Fritz and Ben Shelton all reach the quarterfinals here, it will be the **first time that multiple American men have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon since 2000** – when Andre Agassi, Jan-Michael Gambill and Pete Sampras all reached the quarterfinals here. Multiple American men have reached the quarterfinals at 2 of the last 6 Grand Slam tournaments – at the 2023 Australian Open (Shelton, Paul and Sebastian Korda) and the 2023 US Open (Shelton, Fritz and Frances Tiafoe).
- Paul is bidding to reach his 2nd Grand Slam quarterfinal and become the **54th American man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams on multiple occasions**. He would become the 5th active American man to do so – after Fritz, Tennys Sandgren, Shelton and Tiafoe.

- Wimbledon is Paul's **2nd-most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of matches won, after the Australian Open.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Paul and Fritz have become the **38th and 39th American men in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – and the first active American man to do so.
- By reaching the round of 16 here this year, Paul has **equalled his best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the round of 16 on his debut here in 2022, when he defeated Fernando Verdasco, Adrian Mannarino and Jiri Vesely before falling to Cameron Norrie.
- Last year here**, Paul reached the 3rd round. He defeated Shintaro Mochizuki and Milos Raonic before falling to Lehecka in 5 sets.
- Paul's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals at the 2023 Australian Open (l. Novak Djokovic). He is the only American man to have reached the semifinals at the Australian Open since Andy Roddick in 2009.
- In Grand Slam play this year**, Paul reached the 3rd round at both the Australian Open (l. Miomir Kecmanovic) and Roland Garros (l. Francisco Cerundolo).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Paul **won his first grass court title** at Queen's, defeating Lorenzo Musetti in the final. He became the 8th American man in the Open Era to win the title at Queen's and the first since Sam Querrey in 2010. He also reached the quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Korda) but withdrew from Eastbourne due to fatigue.
- Paul is bidding to become the **9th man in the Open Era to win the title at Queen's and Wimbledon in the same year** – after John McEnroe (1981, 1984), Jimmy Connors (1982), Boris Becker (1985), Pete Sampras (1995, 1999), Lleyton Hewitt (2002), Rafael Nadal (2008), Andy Murray (2013, 2016) and Carlos Alcaraz (2023).
- Paul is bidding to become **the first American man to win multiple Tour-level titles on grass in the same year since 1999**, when Sampras won the titles at both Queen's and Wimbledon.
- Paul's **other highlights in 2024** are winning the title at Dallas (d. Marcos Giron), finishing runner-up at Delray Beach (l. Taylor Fritz), reaching the semifinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Daniil Medvedev) and Rome-1000 (l. Nicolas Jarry) and reaching the quarterfinals at Adelaide (l. Jack Draper). He is one of 10 players to have won multiple Tour-level titles prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Paul's 5-set victory against Otto Virtanen in the 2nd round here this year was his first victory in a **5-set match at Wimbledon**. He lost the only 5-set match he had previously contested here, against Jiri Lehecka in the 3rd round last year. He has a 7-5 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Paul broke the Top 20 for the first time in January 2023 and reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 12 in October 2023. He plays here one place lower at No. 13.
- Paul is one of **3 seeded American men** to reach the round of 16 here from the 5 who began the main draw. USA has more seeded players in the draw than any other nation.
- Paul had a **successful junior career**. He won the 2015 Roland Garros boys' singles title (d. Fritz), finished runner-up in the boys' singles at the 2015 US Open (l. Fritz) and reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 3 in September 2015. He reached the quarterfinals on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2016 (l. Patrik-Niklas Salminen).
- Paul made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2020 for USA and has a 5-4 win-loss record in the competition. USA defeated Ukraine in the Qualifiers in February to reach the 2024 Davis Cup Finals and will compete in Group C in Zhuhai alongside Germany, Slovakia and Chile.
- Paul is coached by Brad Stine.

- **BAUTISTA AGUT** is bidding to reaching the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time. This is his 10th Wimbledon appearance and his 44th Grand Slam overall.
- Bautista Agut is bidding to become the **5th Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Rafael Nadal (8 Wimbledon quarterfinal appearances), Feliciano Lopez (3), David Ferrer and Juan Carlos Ferrero (both 2). (NB Carlos Alcaraz is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time today)
- Bautista Agut is bidding to become the **17th Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam on 3 or more occasions** – after Nadal (47 Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances), Ferrer (17), Ferrero and Manuel Orantes (both 9), Carlos Moya and Alcaraz (both 8), Tommy Robredo (7), Alex Corretja (6), Albert Costa and Andres Gimeno (both 5), and Nicolas Almagro, Sergi Bruguera, Pablo Carreno Busta, Jose Higueras, Feliciano Lopez and Fernando Verdasco (all 4). (NB Alcaraz is bidding to reach his 9th Grand Slam quarterfinal today)
- Aged 36 years 91 days, Bautista Agut is bidding to become the **5th man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals here aged 36 or older** – after Roger Federer (3 Wimbledon quarterfinal appearances aged 36 or older), Ken Rosewall (2) and Novak Djokovic and Nadal (both one). (NB Djokovic will bid to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time since turning 36 on Monday; ages calculated at end of the tournament)
- Bautista Agut is also bidding to become the **oldest Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam** – ahead of Nadal, who reached the quarterfinals here in 2022 aged 36 years 37 days.
- Wimbledon is Bautista Agut's **joint-most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of matches won and quarterfinals reached, alongside the Australian Open.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Bautista Agut has become the **9th man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 here aged 36 or older** and the 20th man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam aged 36 or older.
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Bautista Agut has become the **oldest Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon**, ahead of Nadal in 2022. He has also become the 2nd-oldest Spanish man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam – after Nadal, who reached the round of 16 at the 2022 US Open aged 36 years 100 days.
- Bautista Agut's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals here in 2019, when he fell to Djokovic in 4 sets.
- **Last year here**, Bautista Agut fell in the 1st round here last year (l. Roman Safiullin).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Bautista Agut fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Ben Shelton) and Roland Garros (l. Jaume Munar). His victories in the opening 2 rounds here ended a 4-match losing streak at the Grand Slams – he had previously not recorded a Grand Slam match-win since reaching the 2nd round at 2023 Roland Garros (d. Wu Yibing, l. Juan Pablo Varillas).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Bautista Agut reached the quarterfinals at Mallorca, where he defeated Taro Daniel and Ugo Humbert before falling to Monfils. He also reached the 2nd round at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Marc-Andrea Huesler, l. Milos Raonic) but lost in the 2nd round of qualifying at Halle (d. Pierre-Hugues Herbert, l. Max Purcell).
- Bautista Agut's **best Tour-level results in 2024** are reaching the quarterfinals at Hong Kong (l. Sebastian Ofner) and Mallorca and reaching the 3rd round as a wild card at Barcelona (l. Cameron Norrie). He also reached the quarterfinals at the Bordeaux Challenger (FRA) (l. Pedro Martinez).
- Bautista Agut has **won one Tour-level title on grass** – at 2014 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Benjamin Becker). He has won 8 other titles on hard courts and 2 on clay.

- Bautista Agut has won 3 of the 4 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, defeating Fognini in the 3rd round here this year, Benoit Paire in the 2nd round in 2015 and Miomir Kecmanovic in the 2nd round in 2021, but falling to Safiullin in the 1st round last year. He has a 14-12 record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Bautista Agut is bidding to end a **5-match losing streak against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams**. He has not defeated a Top 20 player at the Grand Slams since defeating No. 9 Karen Khachanov in the 3rd round here in 2019. He has a 7-20 win-loss record against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams and a 40-99 win-loss record against Top 20 player at Tour-level overall.
- Bautista Agut is a **former Top 10 player**. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 9 in November 2019. He plays here at No. 112.
- Bautista Agut has played **Davis Cup** since 2014 and has a 13-7 win-loss record in the competition. He was part of the Spain team that won the competition for the 6th time in 2019, winning 2 of the 3 singles matches he played at the Finals. Spain received a wild card to compete at the 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage in September and will compete in Group B in Valencia alongside Australia, Czechia and France.
- Bautista Agut is coached by Daniel Gimeno-Traver and Jose Luis Vendrell Bru.
