On court today...

- Novak Djokovic returns to court to face Holger Rune today, with the 24-time Grand Slam champion aiming to reach his 15th quarterfinal at Wimbledon and his 60th quarterfinal at the Grand Slams this afternoon. Djokovic has played himself into form with 3 confident wins on his return from injury over the last 7 days – but Rune represents the greatest danger he has faced here so far. The Dane owns 2 career victories against Djokovic and, aged just 21, has already reached a quarterfinal at Wimbledon, having fallen to eventual champion Carlos Alcaraz in the last 8 in 2023. If Rune is to progress to the quarterfinals again this year, however, he will need to end a poor run of recent form against the game's elite players – he is without a win against a Top 5 player in more than a year, having lost his last 9 encounters with Top 5 opposition.
- On No. 2 Court today, Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard will be hoping to celebrate his 21st birthday by securing a unique piece of Grand Slam history for himself when he takes on Italian 25th seed Lorenzo Musetti. Mpetshi Perricard fell in the final round of qualifying but gained entry to the main draw as a lucky loser following the withdrawal of Alejandro Davidovich Fokina – and should he win today, he will become the first lucky loser, man or woman, to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam. But while he has made the most of his second chance here this year, he will be wary of the threat posed by Musetti – the Italian won when the pair met for the first time at Stuttgart last month, and has been in top form throughout the grass court season, reaching his first Tour-level final on grass before winning his opening 3 matches here.

A 6th meeting for Djokovic and Rune and their 2nd at a Grand Slam but their first on grass. Djokovic won their only previous meeting at a Grand Slam, in the 1st round at the 2021 US Open, when Rune was making his Grand Slam main draw debut as an 18-year-old qualifier ranked at No. 145 in the world.

Rune is bidding to defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time. He has a 1-4 win-loss record against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, with his only win coming against No. 4 Stefanos Tsitsipas in the round of 16 at 2022 Roland Garros. He lost the only previous match he contested against a Top 5 player at Wimbledon, against No. 1 Alcaraz in the quarterfinals last year. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Wimbledon is No. 24 Grigor Dimitrov in the round of 16 last year.

Rune is bidding to end a 9-match losing streak against Top 5 players at Tour-level. After losing his first match against a Top 5 player to No. 1 Djokovic in the 1st round at the 2021 US Open, he won his next 7 matches against Top 5 players before losing his 9 most-recent matches against Top 5 players. His last victory against a Top 5 player at Tour-level came against No. 4 Ruud in the semifinals at 2023 Rome-1000. He has a 7-10 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

- **DJOKOVIC** is bidding to reach his 15th Wimbledon quarterfinal and claim sole ownership of 2nd place on the all-time list for most Wimbledon men's singles quarterfinal appearances.

- Djokovic is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the 60th time and extend his **all-time record for the most quarterfinal appearances at the Grand Slams**. He equalled Roger Federer in first place on the list by reaching his 59th Grand Slam quarterfinal at the Australian Open this year, and claimed sole ownership of the record by reaching his 60th Grand Slam quarterfinal at Roland Garros last month.

- Djokovic is bidding to record his 374th Grand Slam match-win. By defeating Francisco Cerundolo in the round of 16 at Roland Garros this year for his 370th Grand Slam match-win, he claimed sole ownership of the **all-time record for most Grand Slam singles matches won among men and women**, ahead of Federer.

- Djokovic is bidding to record his 96th Wimbledon match-win and equal Chris Evert in **4th place on the all-time list for most Wimbledon singles matches won among men and women**.

- Aged 37 years 53 days, Djokovic is bidding to become the **3rd man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon aged 37 or older** – after Ken Rosewall (who reached the quarterfinals here as a 39-year-old in 1974) and Federer (who reached the quarterfinals here in 2019 as a 37-year-old and again in 2021 as a 39-year-old). (NB ages calculated at end of the tournament)
- Djokovic is also bidding to become the **5th man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams aged 37 or older on multiple occasions** – after Rosewall (7 Grand Slam quarterfinals appearances aged 37 or older), Federer (5) and Jimmy Connors and Pancho Gonzales (both 2). (NB ages calculated at end of the tournament)
- Wimbledon is Djokovic's **2nd most-successful Grand Slam event in terms of matches won**, and joint-2nd most successful Grand Slam event in terms of quarterfinals reached. (see table overleaf)

- By reaching the round of 16 here for the 16th time, Djokovic has equalled Connors in **2nd place on the Open Era list for most round of 16 appearances at Wimbledon**. Federer, who reached the round of 16 here on 18 occasions, is the only man in the Open Era to have reached the round of 16 here more often than Djokovic.
- Djokovic has now also reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 65th time. He is in **2nd place on the Open Era list for most round of 16 appearances at the Grand Slams**, behind Federer (69 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances).
- By reaching the round of 16 here this year, Djokovic has become the **4th man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon aged 37 or older** – after Gonzales (who reached the round of 16 here as a 41-year-old in 1969) and Federer and Rosewall, who both made 2 appearances in the last 16 here after turning 37. (NB ages calculated at end of the tournament)
- Last year here, Djokovic reached his **9th Wimbledon final**, falling to Carlos Alcaraz in 5 sets. On his 8 other appearances in Wimbledon finals, he won the title in 2011 (d. Rafael Nadal), 2014 (d. Federer), 2015 (d. Federer), 2018 (d. Kevin Anderson), 2019 (d. Federer), 2021 (d. Matteo Berrettini) and 2022 (d. Nick Kyrgios) and finished runner-up in 2013 (l. Andy Murray).
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **8th Wimbledon title** and equal Federer's all-time record for the most Wimbledon men's singles titles won. He is also bidding to equal Federer and Helen Wills Moody in 2nd place on the list for most Wimbledon singles titles won among men and women, behind 9-time Wimbledon champion Martina Navratilova.
- Djokovic won his **22nd, 23rd and 24th Grand Slam titles in 2024** – he equalled Nadal's all-time record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles at the Australian Open (d. Stefanos Tsitsipas), claimed sole ownership of the record at Roland Garros (d. Casper Ruud) and equalled Margaret Court's all-time record for most Grand Slam singles titles among men and women at the US Open (d. Daniil Medvedev).
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **25th Grand Slam title** and claim sole ownership of the all-time record for most Grand Slam singles titles won among men and women.
- Djokovic is bidding to become the **oldest man in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon title** and the first player in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon titles after turning 35. In 2022, aged 35 years 49 days, Djokovic became the 2nd player in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon aged 35 or older – after Federer, who won the title here in 2017 aged 35 years 342 days. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **5th Grand Slam title since turning 35** and extend his Open Era record for most Grand Slam singles titles won aged 35 or older. He is also bidding to win his 13th Grand Slam title since turning 30 and extend his record for most Grand Slam singles titles won after the age of 30 in the Open Era.
- Djokovic has **won 37 of his last 38 matches at Wimbledon and 37 of his last 38 Tour-level matches on grass**. His defeat to Alcaraz in the final last year ended a 34-match winning streak at Wimbledon – he had previously not lost here since retiring due to a right elbow injury in his quarterfinal match against Tomas Berdych in 2017. The defeat to Alcaraz also ended a 34-match Tour-level winning streak on grass – he had previously not lost a grass court match since falling to Marin Cilic in the final at 2018 Queen's.
- Djokovic is making his **19th consecutive Wimbledon appearance and contesting his 75th Grand Slam overall**. He is in joint-4th place on the Open Era list for most Wimbledon men's singles appearances alongside Fernando Verdasco – behind Federer (22 Wimbledon appearances) and Jimmy Connors and Feliciano Lopez (both 20). He is in 3rd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles appearances – behind Federer and Lopez (both 81).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Djokovic reached the semifinals at the Australian Open (l. Jannik Sinner) and the quarterfinals at Roland Garros, where he gave a walkover to Casper Ruud due to a right knee injury.
- Djokovic's **other highlights in 2024** are reaching the semifinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Ruud) and Geneva (l. Tomas Machac). He contested just 7 events prior to Wimbledon this season.

- Djokovic **did not contest a grass court tournament prior to Wimbledon this year**. He is one of just 7 men in the Open Era to have won the title here without playing a warm-up event on grass, achieving the feat in 2011, 2014, 2015, 2019, 2021 and 2022. He is one of 16 players who began the men's singles here who had not competed on grass this season prior to Wimbledon.
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **99th Tour-level title**. He is in 3rd place on the Open Era list for most Tour-level titles won – behind Connors (109 Tour-level titles) and Federer (103). Of Djokovic's 98 Tour-level singles titles, 8 have come on grass – in addition to his 7 Wimbledon titles, he also won the title on grass at 2017 Eastbourne (d. Gael Monfils). He has won 71 titles on hard courts and 19 titles on clay.
- Djokovic has a 10-2 win-loss record in **5-set matches** at Wimbledon, with his only defeats in 5-set matches here coming against Mario Ancic in the round of 16 in 2006 and against Alcaraz in the final last year. He holds the record for most 5-set matches won at the Grand Slams (38-9) and has a 40-11 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Djokovic **holds the record for most weeks ranked No. 1**, having held the top ranking for a total of 428 weeks. His most-recent spell as world No. 1 ended last month, when he dropped to No. 3 following his withdrawal from Roland Garros. He rose to No. 2 on 24 June and plays here at the same ranking.
- Djokovic has played **Davis Cup** for Serbia since 2004, has a 44-16 win-loss record in the competition and led Serbia to their only title in the competition to date in 2010. Serbia will host Greece in a World Group I tie in September.
- Djokovic is currently without a permanent coach.
- **RUNE** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 12th Grand Slam overall.
- Rune is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the 4th time and equal Kurt Nielsen's **all-time record for most Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances by a Danish man**. Nielsen reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon in 1953, 1955 and 1958, and at the 1953 US Championships. Nielsen, Rune and Jan Leschly (who reached the quarterfinals at the 1967 US Championships) are the only Danish men in history to have reached the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams.
- Aged 21 years 76 days, Rune is bidding to reach his 2nd Wimbledon quarterfinal and become the **14th player in the Open Era to make multiple Wimbledon men's singles quarterfinal appearances aged 21 or under** – after Boris Becker and Bjorn Borg (4 Wimbledon quarterfinal appearances aged 21 or under each), Connors (3) and Carlos Alcaraz, Pat Cash, Roger Federer, Goran Ivanisevic, Tim Mayotte, John McEnroe, Rafael Nadal, Andy Roddick, Pete Sampras and Jannik Sinner (all 2). (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- If Rune, Arthur Fils (20 years 32 days) and Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard (21 years 6 days) all win today and join Alcaraz (21 years 70 days) in the round of 16 here, they will equal the **Open Era record for most men aged 21 or under to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – there also 4 men aged 21 or under in the quarterfinals here in 1973 and 2007. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- If at least 2 of Rune, Fils and Mpetshi Perricard win today, it will be **7th time in the Open Era that 3 or more men aged 21 or under have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – and the 2nd time in consecutive years, after Alcaraz, Rune and Sinner all reached the quarterfinals here aged 21 or under in 2023.
- Wimbledon is Rune's **2nd-most successful Grand Slam event** in terms of matches won and quarterfinals reached, after Roland Garros.

- By reaching the round of 16 here for the 2nd time, Rune has become the **3rd Danish man in history to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Nielsen (who reached the last 16 here in 1953-55 and 1958) and Jørgen Ulrich (1959-60 and 1964).

- By reaching the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 6th time, Rune has equalled Torben Ulrich in **2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by a Danish man**. Nielsen, who reached the round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 11 occasions, is the only Danish man to have reached the round of 16 at the Grand Slams more often than Rune.
- Last year here, Rune equalled his **best Grand Slam result** by reaching the quarterfinals. He defeated George Loffhagen, Roberto Carballes Baena, Alejandro Davidovich Fokina and Grigor Dimitrov before falling to Carlos Alcaraz. He became the first Danish man to record a match-win at Wimbledon since Kenneth Carlsen in 2004. He also reached the quarterfinals at Roland Garros in both 2022 and 2023, losing to Casper Ruud on both occasions.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Rune reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros, falling to Alexander Zverev in 5 sets, but fell in the 2nd round at the Australian Open (d. Yoshihito Nishioka, l. Arthur Cazaux).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Rune fell in the 1st round at Queen's (l. Jordan Thompson).
- Rune's **best result in 2024** is finishing runner-up at Brisbane (l. Grigor Dimitrov). He also reached the semifinals at Montpellier, where he retired due to a right arm injury against Borna Coric, Acapulco (l. Casper Ruud) and Munich (l. Jan-Lennard Struff) and reached the quarterfinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Daniil Medvedev) and Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Sinner).
- Rune's win against Halys in the 3rd round here this year was his **first successful comeback from 0-2 down**. He has won both 5-set matches he has contested at Wimbledon, also defeating Davidovich Fokina in the 3rd round last year. He has a 3-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Rune **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in November 2022 after winning the title at Paris-1000. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 4 in August 2023 and plays here at No. 15 – his lowest ranking since October 2022.
- Rune is a **former junior world No. 1**. He won the boys' singles title at 2019 Roland Garros (d. Toby Kodat) and reached the top ranking in October that year. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (l. Anton Matusevich).
- Rune made his **Davis Cup** debut for Denmark in 2018 and has a 7-2 win-loss record in the competition. Denmark play away against Kazakhstan in a World Group I tie in September.
- Rune is coached by Kenneth Carlsen and Patrick Mouratoglou.

A 9th meeting for Zverev and Fritz, and their 3rd at the Grand Slams. Both of their previous Grand Slam meetings have come at Wimbledon – the pair have now met here at 3-year intervals, and one round further in the tournament on each occasion. Zverev won their first meeting here in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2018 and their 2nd meeting here in 4 sets in the 3rd round in 2021.

In addition to their 8 previous meetings as professionals, Zverev and Fritz also met once at junior-level – in the 1st round of the boys' singles at the 2013 US Open, with Zverev winning 63 76(2).

Zverev and Fritz are both former junior world No. 1s, junior Grand Slam winners and ITF Junior World Champions. Zverev reached the junior No. 1 ranking in October 2013, was named ITF Junior World Champion for 2013 and won the boys' singles title at the 2014 Australian Open. Fritz reached the junior No. 1 ranking in June 2015, won the boys' singles title at the 2015 US Open and was named ITF Junior World Champion for 2015. Zverev reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles at Wimbledon in 2013, while Fritz reached the boys' singles semifinal here in 2015.

Zverev is bidding to end a 4-match losing streak against Top 20 players on grass. He has a 2-5 win-loss record against Top 20 players on grass, with his victories coming against No. 3 Roger Federer in the semifinals at 2016 Halle and against No. 19 Roberto Bautista Agut in the quarterfinals at 2017 Halle – but he has lost all 4 matches he has contested against Top 20 players on grass since then.

Zverev is bidding to defeat a Top 20 player at Wimbledon for the first time. He has lost all 3 matches he has contested against Top 20 players here. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Wimbledon is No. 40 Fritz in the 3rd round here in 2021. He has a 12-20 win-loss record against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams and a 95-94 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.

Fritz is bidding to defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the first time on his 10th attempt. He has lost all 9 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, including all 3 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at Wimbledon. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at the Grand Slams is No. 7 Stefanos Tsitsipas in the round of 16 at the Australian Open this year. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Wimbledon is No. 19 Alejandro Tabilo in the 3rd round this year.

Fritz has won one of the 6 matches he has contested against Top 5 players since the beginning of the 2023 season. His only victory against a Top 5 player in that time came against No. 3 Tsitsipas in the quarterfinals at 2023 Monte Carlo-1000. He has a 5-21 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

- **ZVEREV** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 34th Grand Slam overall.
- Zverev is bidding to become the **12th German man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after Boris Becker (11 Wimbledon quarterfinal appearances), Michael Stich (4), Florian Mayer and Alexander Popp (both 2), and Jurgen Fassbender, Tommy Haas, Nicolas Kiefer, Philipp Kohlschreiber, Patrick Kuhn, Alex Radulescu and Rainer Schuettler (all one).
- Zverev is bidding to reach his **13th Grand Slam quarterfinal**. By reaching his 11th Grand Slam quarterfinal at the Australian Open this year, he claimed sole ownership of 2nd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances by a German man, ahead of Stich. Becker, who reached 23 Grand Slam quarterfinals, is the only German man in the Open Era to have reached the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams more often than Zverev.
- Zverev is bidding to claim sole ownership of **6th place on the list of active players to reach 10 or more Grand Slam men's singles quarterfinals**, ahead of Kei Nishikori. Novak Djokovic (who is bidding to reach his 60th Grand Slam quarterfinal here), Rafael Nadal (47 Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances), Andy Murray (30), Stan Wawrinka (18) and Marin Cilic (14) are the only active male players to have reached the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams more often than Zverev.
- Zverev is bidding to complete the set of Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances and become the **14th active player to have reached the men's singles quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam events** – after Carlos Alcaraz, Matteo Berrettini, Cilic, Grigor Dimitrov, Djokovic, Karen Khachanov, Daniil Medvedev, Murray, Nadal, Nishikori, Andrey Rublev, Jannik Sinner and Stan Wawrinka.
- Zverev is also bidding to become the **4th German man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at all 4 Grand Slam events** – after Becker, Haas and Stich.
- Wimbledon is Zverev's **least successful Grand Slam** event in terms of matches won and quarterfinals reached.

- By reaching the round of 16 here, Zverev has become the **4th German man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on 3 or more occasions** – after Becker (12 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances), Stich (5), and Haas and Popp (both 3).
- Zverev is through to the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 19th time. He is in **2nd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by a German man** – behind Becker, who reached the round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 31 occasions.
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Zverev has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the round of 16 in 2017 (l. Milos Raonic) and in 2021 (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime).

- **Last year here**, as No. 19 seed, Zverev reached the 3rd round. He defeated Gijs Brouwer and Yosuke Watanuki before falling to Matteo Berrettini.
- Zverev reached his **2nd Grand Slam final** at 2024 Roland Garros, falling to Carlos Alcaraz in 5 sets. He became the 2nd German man in the Open Era to reach the final at Roland Garros, after 1996 runner-up Stich. He also finished runner-up at the 2020 US Open, falling to Dominic Thiem in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Zverev reached the semifinals at the Australian Open, where he fell to Daniil Medvedev in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead.
- Zverev is bidding to become the **3rd German man to win the Wimbledon title in the Open Era**, after Becker (1985-86, 1989) and Stich (1991).
- If Zverev wins his first title on his 34th appearance at the Grand Slams, he will go **joint-3rd on the Open Era list for most attempts before winning a first Grand Slam men's singles title** – alongside Petr Korda, who won his first Grand Slam title at the 1998 Australian Open on his 34th Grand Slam appearance. Goran Ivanisevic (who won his first Grand Slam title at 2001 Wimbledon on his 48th Grand Slam appearance) and Stan Wawrinka (who won his first Grand Slam title at the 2014 Australian Open on his 36th Grand Slam appearance) are the top 2 players on the list.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Zverev reached the semifinals at Halle. He defeated Oscar Otte, Lorenzo Sonego and Arthur Fils before falling to Hubert Hurkacz.
- Zverev's **best result in 2024** is winning the title at Rome-1000 (d. Nicolas Jarry). His other highlights this season are reaching the semifinals at Los Cabos (l. Jordan Thompson) and Miami-1000 (l. Grigor Dimitrov) and the quarterfinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Alcaraz) and Munich (l. Cristian Garin).
- Zverev is bidding to record his 41st Tour-level match-win in 2024 and overtake Casper Ruud (40-11) to move into **2nd place on the list for most Tour-level matches won this season**. Sinner is at the top of the list with a 42-3 win-loss record in 2024.
- Zverev's **best performance on grass** is finishing runner-up at Halle in 2016 (l. Florian Mayer) and 2017 (l. Roger Federer).
- Zverev has won 3 of the 6 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He has a 23-12 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Zverev rose to a **career-high ranking** of No. 2 after reaching the semifinals at 2022 Roland Garros. He re-entered the Top 5 for the first time since October 2022 in March this year and plays here at No. 4.
- Zverev **won Olympic singles gold for Germany** at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event in 2021, defeating Russian Olympic Committee's Karen Khachanov in the final. It was Germany's 3rd Olympic gold medal in tennis – after Steffi Graf in women's singles at Seoul 1988 and Becker/Stich in men's doubles at Barcelona 1992.
- Zverev was a **successful junior**. He won the boys' singles title at the 2014 Australian Open, defeating Stefan Kozlov in the final. He also finished runner-up in the boys' singles at 2013 Roland Garros (l. Christian Garin) and was named 2013 ITF Junior World Champion. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2013 (l. Kozlov).
- Zverev has played **Davis Cup** for Germany since 2016 and has a 9-6 overall win-loss record in the competition. Germany defeated Hungary in the Qualifiers in February to reach the 2024 Davis Cup Finals and will compete in Group C in Zhuhai alongside USA, Slovakia and Chile.
- Zverev is coached by his father, Alexander Zverev Sr.
- **FRITZ** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 32nd Grand Slam overall.
- Fritz is bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the 2nd time and become the **20th American man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – and the first since Sam Querrey, who reached the quarterfinals here in 2016, 2017 and 2019. He would become the first active American player to reach the men's singles quarterfinals here on multiple occasions.

- Fritz is bidding to reach his 4th Grand Slam quarterfinal and become the **26th American man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams on 4 or more occasions** – and the first since Querrey, who reached the quarterfinals at the 2017 US Open in addition to his 3 quarterfinal appearances at Wimbledon. He would become the first active American player to reach the men’s singles quarterfinals at the Grand Slams on 4 or more occasions.
- If Fritz wins today and joins Tommy Paul in the quarterfinals here, it will be the **first time that multiple American men have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon since 2000** – when Andre Agassi, Jan-Michael Gambill and Pete Sampras all reached the quarterfinals here. Multiple American men have reached the quarterfinals at 2 of the last 6 Grand Slam tournaments – at the 2023 Australian Open (Paul, Sebastian Korda and Ben Shelton) and the 2023 US Open (Fritz, Shelton and Frances Tiafoe).
- Wimbledon is Fritz’s **2nd-most successful Grand Slam** event in terms of matches won, after the Australian Open.

- By both reaching the round of 16 here for the 2nd time, Fritz and Paul have become the **38th and 39th American man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions**. They are the only active American men to have reached the round of 16 here on multiple occasions.
- **Last year here**, Fritz reached the 2nd round, defeating Yannick Hanfmann in 5 sets before falling to Mikael Ymer in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead. He has a 2-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Wimbledon and a 10-10 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Fritz’s **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 3 occasions – including at 2022 Wimbledon, when he fell to Rafael Nadal in 5 sets. He also reached back-to-back Grand Slam quarterfinals at the 2023 US Open and 2024 Australian Open, falling to Novak Djokovic on both occasions.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Fritz reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros (l. Casper Ruud).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this season**, Fritz won his 3rd title at Eastbourne, defeating Max Purcell in the final to become the first 3-time champion in the tournament’s history. He also reached the quarterfinals at Queen’s (l. Jordan Thompson). He is one of 7 players competing here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- Fritz is bidding to become **the first American man to win multiple Tour-level titles on grass in the same year since 1999**, when Sampras won the titles at both Queen’s and Wimbledon.
- Fritz’s **other highlights in 2024** are winning the title at Delray Beach (d. Tommy Paul), finishing runner-up at Munich (l. Jan-Lennard Struff), reaching the semifinals at Madrid-1000 (l. Andrey Rublev) and reaching the quarterfinals at Rome-1000 (l. Alexander Zverev). He is one of 10 players to have won multiple Tour-level titles this season.
- Fritz is bidding to **record a streak of 8 consecutive Tour-level match-wins for the 3rd time**. His longest Tour-level winning streak is 9 consecutive victories in 2022, when he won a match during USA’s Davis Cup Qualifiers victory over Colombia, won 6 matches en route to the title at Indian Wells-1000 and won 2 matches en route to a round of 16 finish at Miami-1000. His longest Tour-level winning streak on grass is 8 consecutive victories in 2022, when he won 4 matches en route to the title at Eastbourne before winning 4 matches en route to a quarterfinal finish here.
- Fritz is one of **3 seeded American men** to reach the round of 16 here from the 5 who began the main draw. USA has more seeded players in the draw than any other nation.
- Fritz reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 5 in February 2023. He plays here at No. 12.
- Fritz is a **former junior world No. 1**. He was named 2015 ITF Junior World Champion after winning the boys’ singles title at the 2015 US Open (d. Paul). He also finished as runner-up in the boys’ singles at 2015 Roland Garros (l. Paul). His best result in the boys’ singles here was reaching the semifinals in 2015 (l. Reilly Opelka).

- Fritz made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2019 and has a 6-3 win-loss record in the competition. USA defeated Ukraine in the Qualifiers in February to reach the 2024 Davis Cup Finals and will compete in Group C in Zhuhai alongside Germany, Slovakia and Chile.
- Both of Fritz's parents were professional tennis players. His mother, Kathy May, is a former Top 10 player.
- Fritz is coached by Michael Russell and Paul Annacone.

Fils is facing a Top 10 player for the 2nd time at Wimbledon this year, having defeated No. 7 Hubert Hurkacz in the 2nd round. He has a 3-5 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level – in addition to his victory against Hurkacz, he also defeated No. 4 Casper Ruud in the quarterfinals at 2023 Hamburg and No. 7 Stefanos Tsitsipas in the semifinals at 2023 Antwerp. His victory against Hurkacz ended a 4-match losing streak against Top 10 players – he had previously not defeated a Top 10 player since defeating Tsitsipas at Antwerp last year.

- De Minaur is bidding to become the **20th Australian man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon**. He would become the 3rd active Australian male player to reach the quarterfinals here – after Bernard Tomic in 2011 and Nick Kyrgios in 2014 and 2022.
- De Minaur is bidding to reach his 3rd Grand Slam quarterfinal and become the **22nd Australian man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at the Grand Slams on 3 or more occasions**. He would become the 2nd active Australian male player to reach 3 or more Grand Slam quarterfinals – after Kyrgios, who reached the quarterfinals at the 2015 Australian Open and the 2022 US Open in addition to his 2 quarterfinal appearances here.

- By reaching the round of 16 here for the 2nd time, De Minaur has become the **21st Australian man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions**. He has become the 3rd active Australian man to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions – after Kyrgios (4 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances) and Tomic (3).
- By reaching the round of 16 at the Grand Slams for the 9th time, De Minaur has claimed sole ownership of first place on the list for **most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances among active Australian men**, ahead of Kyrgios.
- By reaching the round of 16 here, De Minaur has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the round of 16 in 2022, when he defeated Hugo Dellien, Jack Draper and Liam Broady before falling to Cristian Garin in 5 sets, despite leading 2-0 and having 2 match points.
- De Minaur's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 2 occasions – at the 2020 US Open (l. Dominic Thiem) and at Roland Garros this year (l. Alexander Zverev).
- **Last year here**, De Minaur reached the 2nd round (d. Kimmer Coppejans, l. Matteo Berrettini).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, De Minaur reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open, falling to Andrey Rublev in 5 sets.
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, De Minaur won his **9th Tour-level title** – and 2nd on grass – at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Sebastian Korda). He also competed at Queen's but fell to Lorenzo Musetti in the 1st round. His other grass court title came at 2021 Eastbourne (d. Lorenzo Sonogo). He is one of 6 players competing here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- De Minaur's **other highlights in 2024** are winning the title at Acapulco (d. Casper Ruud), finishing runner-up at Rotterdam (l. Jannik Sinner) and reaching the quarterfinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Djokovic). He is one of 10 players to have won multiple Tour-level titles in 2024.
- De Minaur has lost both **5-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Steve Johnson in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2019 and to Garin in the round of 16 in 2022. He has a 3-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- De Minaur **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in January this year and reached a career-high ranking of No. 7 last month. He plays here 2 places lower at No. 9.
- De Minaur is a **former Wimbledon boys' singles finalist**. He reached the boys' singles final here in 2016 (l. Denis Shapovalov). He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in February 2016 and also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at the 2015 US Open (l. Tommy Paul) and the 2016 Australian Open (l. Jurabek Karimov).
- De Minaur is coached by Adolfo Gutierrez.
- **FILS** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and his 6th Grand Slam overall.
- Aged 20 years 32 days, Fils is bidding to become the **youngest Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam**. The youngest French players to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at a Grand Slam in the Open Era are Yannick Noah (21 years 20 days) at 1981 Roland Garros and Richard Gasquet (21 years 20 days) at 2007 Wimbledon. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- If Fils, Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard (21 years 6 days) and Holger Rune (21 years 76 days) all win today and join Carlos Alcaraz (21 years 70 days) in the round of 16 here, they will equal the **Open Era record for most men aged 21 or under to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – there were 4 men aged 21 or under in the quarterfinals here in 1973 and 2007. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)

- If at least 2 of Fils, Mpetshi Perricard and Rune win today, it will be **7th time in the Open Era that 3 or more men aged 21 or under have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – and the 2nd time in consecutive years, after Alcaraz, Rune and Jannik Sinner all reached the quarterfinals here aged 21 or under in 2023.
- Fils is bidding to become the **12th Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after Cedric Pioline and Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (4 quarterfinal appearances here), Guy Forget, Sebastian Grosjean and Henri Leconte (all 3), Gasquet (2) and Thierry Champion, Arnaud Clement, Nicolas Escude, Lucas Pouille and Gilles Simon (all one). (NB Mpetshi Perricard is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time)
- Fils is bidding to become the **22nd Frenchman in the Open Era** to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam. He would become the 4th active French male player to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam – after Gasquet, Monfils and Pouille. (NB Mpetshi Perricard are also bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time here)
- If Fils and Mpetshi Perricard both reach the quarterfinals here, it will be the **4th time in the Open Era that multiple Frenchmen have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after 1991 (when Champion and Forget reached the quarterfinals), 2015 (Gasquet and Simon) and 2016 (Pouille and Tsonga).
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Fils has become the **youngest Frenchman to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 2005**, when Gasquet reached the round of 16 here aged 19 years 15 days.
- By both reaching the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time here, Fils and Mpetshi Perricard have become the **49th and 50th Frenchmen in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at the Grand Slams** – and the 26th and 27th Frenchmen in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon.
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Fils has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best Grand Slam result was reaching the 2nd round at a Grand Slam on 2 occasions – at the 2023 US Open (d. Tallon Griekspoor, I. Matteo Arnaldi) and the Australian Open this year (d. Jiri Vesely, I. Griekspoor).
- **Last year here**, as a wild card on his Wimbledon debut, Fils lost to Alejandro Davidovich Fokina in the 1st round.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Fils lost in the 1st round at Roland Garros (I. Arnaldi).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Fils reached the quarterfinals at Halle, where he defeated Tomas Machac and Dominik Koepfer before falling to Alexander Zverev, and the 2nd round at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Arthur Cazaux, I. Ugo Humbert).
- Fils' **best Tour-level result in 2024** is reaching the semifinals at Auckland (I. Alejandro Tabilo). He has also reached 4 Tour-level quarterfinals this season – at Hong Kong (I. Andrey Rublev), Santiago (I. Pedro Martinez), Barcelona (I. Dusan Lajovic) and Halle. He also won the title at Bordeaux Challenger (FRA) (d. Martinez).
- Fils has won 2 of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested, including his 5-set victory against Roman Safiullin the 3rd round here this year. He also contested 2 five-set matches at the US Open last year – he defeated Griekspoor in the 1st round in 5 sets before falling to Arnaldi in the 2nd round, also in 5 sets.
- Fils reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 30 in May. He plays here at No. 34.
- Fils was a **successful junior**. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 3 in July 2021, a month after finishing runner-up in the boys' singles at 2021 Roland Garros (I. Luca van Assche). He also won the 2021 Roland Garros boys' doubles title alongside Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard. He reached the 2nd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles at Wimbledon in 2021 (d. Kokoro Isomura, I. Victor Lilov).
- Fils made his **Davis Cup** debut for France at the 2023 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage, falling to Daniel Evans in the only match he has contested in the competition to date. France defeated Chinese Taipei in the Qualifiers in February to advance to the 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage. They will compete in Group B in Valencia alongside Australia, Czechia and Spain.
- Fils is coached by 2-time Roland Garros champion Sergi Bruguera and Sebastien Grosjean, who reached the semifinals here in 2003 and 2004.

- **MUSETTI** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 14th Grand Slam overall.
- Musetti is bidding become the **7th Italian man in history to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after Uberto de Morpurgo (1928), Nicola Pietrangeli (1955 and 1960), Adriano Panatta (1979), Davide Sanguinetti (1998), Matteo Berrettini (2021) and Jannik Sinner (2022, 2023 and 2024).
- If Musetti wins today and joins Sinner in the quarterfinals here, it will be the **first time in history that multiple Italian men have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon**. It will be the 7th time that multiple Italian men have reached the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam – after Roland Garros in 1948 (Giovanni Cucelli and Marcello del Bello), 1956 (Giuseppe Merlo and Pietrangeli), 1960 (Pietrangeli and Orlando Sirola) and 1973 (Paolo Bertolucci and Panatta), and the 2022 Australian Open (Berrettini and Sinner) and 2022 US Open (Berrettini and Sinner).
- Musetti is bidding to become the **19th Italian man in history to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam**. He would become the 4th active Italian male player to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam – after Sinner (who has reached his 8th Grand Slam quarterfinal here), Berrettini (6 Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances) and Fabio Fognini (one).
- By reaching the round of 16 here for the first time, Musetti has become the **16th Italian man in history to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon**. He is also the 4th active Italian man to reach the last 16 here – after Berrettini, Sinner and Lorenzo Sonego.

- With both Musetti and Sinner in the round of 16 here, this year is the **4th time in history that multiple Italian men have reached the last 16 at Wimbledon** – after 1949 (Rolando del Bello and Cucelli), 1955 (Merlo and Pietrangeli) and 2021 (Berrettini and Sonogo).
- By reaching the round of 16 here for the first time, Musetti has equalled his **best Grand Slam result**. He has also reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros on 2 occasions – on his Grand Slam debut in 2021, when he led Djokovic 2-0 before retiring due to a lower back injury in the 5th set, and in 2023 (l. Carlos Alcaraz). At 2021 Roland Garros he became the 7th player since 2000 to reach the round of 16 on his Grand Slam debut.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Musetti reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros, where he defeated Daniel Elahi Galan and Gael Monfils before falling to Djokovic, and the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Benjamin Bonzi, l. Luca van Assche)
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Musetti reached his **first Tour-level final on grass** at Queen's (l. Tommy Paul). He also reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (l. Berrettini).
- Musetti's **other Tour-level highlights this season** are reaching the quarterfinals at Adelaide (l. Alexander Bublik) and the round of 16 at Miami-1000 (l. Alcaraz). He has contested 2 events at Challenger-level this season, finishing runner-up at both the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (l. Mariano Navone) and the Turin Challenger (ITA) (l. Francesco Passaro).
- Musetti's 5-set victory over Luciano Darderi in the 2nd round was the **first 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon**. He has a 3-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Musetti **broke the Top 20 for the first time** in January 2023 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 15 in June last year. He plays here at No. 25.
- Musetti is a **former junior world No. 1**, reaching the top ranking in June 2019. He won the boys' singles title at the 2019 Australian Open (d. Emilio Nava) and finished runner-up in the boys' singles at the 2018 US Open (l. Thiago Seyboth Wild). He reached the quarterfinals of the boys' singles here in 2018 (l. Jack Draper).
- Musetti made his **Davis Cup** debut for Italy in 2021 and has a 2-3 win-loss record in the competition. Italy will compete in Bologna alongside Canada, Sweden and Chile in Group A at the 2023 Davis Cup Finals.
- Musetti is coached by Simone Tartarini.
- Lucky loser **MPETSHI PERRICARD** is bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time on his Wimbledon debut. This is his 3rd Grand Slam main draw appearance overall.
- Mpetshi Perricard is bidding to become the **first lucky loser, man or woman, to reach the singles quarterfinals at a Grand Slam**.
- Mpetshi Perricard (aged 21 years 6 days) and Arthur Fils (aged 20 years 32 days) are bidding to become the **youngest Frenchmen in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam**. The youngest French players to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at a Grand Slam in the Open Era are Yannick Noah (21 years 20 days) at 1981 Roland Garros and Richard Gasquet (21 years 20 days) at 2007 Wimbledon. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- If Mpetshi Perricard, Fils and Holger Rune (21 years 76 days) all win today and join Carlos Alcaraz (21 years 70 days) in the round of 16 here, they will equal the **Open Era record for most men aged 21 or under to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – there were 4 men aged 21 or under in the quarterfinals here in 1973 and 2007. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- If at least 2 of Mpetshi Perricard, Fils and Rune win today, it will be **7th time in the Open Era that 3 or more men aged 21 or under have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – and the 2nd time in consecutive years, after Alcaraz, Rune and Jannik Sinner all reached the quarterfinals here aged 21 or under in 2023.
- Mpetshi Perricard is bidding to become the **12th Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after Cedric Pioline and Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (4 quarterfinal appearances here), Guy Forget, Sebastian Grosjean and Henri Leconte (all 3), Gasquet (2) and Thierry Champion, Arnaud Clement, Nicolas Escude, Lucas Pouille and Gilles Simon (all one). (NB Arthu Fils is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals here for the first time)

- Mpetshi Perricard is bidding to become the **22nd Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam**. He would become the 4th active French male player to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam – after Gasquet, Monfils and Pouille. (NB Fils is also bidding to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam for the first time here)
- If Mpetshi Perricard and Fils both reach the quarterfinals here, it will be the **4th time in the Open Era that multiple Frenchmen have reached the quarterfinals at Wimbledon** – after 1991 (when Champion and Forget reached the quarterfinals), 2015 (Gasquet and Simon) and 2016 (Pouille and Tsonga).
- Mpetshi Perricard is bidding to become the **15th man in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals on his Wimbledon debut** – and the 3rd in the last 2 years, after Christopher Eubanks and Roman Safiullin both reached the quarterfinals on their Wimbledon debuts in 2023.

- Mpetshi Perricard is also bidding to become the **first Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the quarterfinals on his Wimbledon debut**. By reaching the round of 16 here on his Wimbledon debut, he has become the 4th Frenchman in the Open Era to reach the last 16 on his debut here – after Sebastian Grosjean (1998), Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (2007) and Ugo Humbert (2019).
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Mpetshi Perricard has become the **5th lucky loser in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after Bernie Mitton and Jaidip Mukerjea (1973), John McCurdy (1983) and Dick Norman (1995).
- By reaching the round of 16 here, Mpetshi Perricard has become the **11th lucky loser in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam**. Since Norman reached the round of 16 as a lucky loser here in 1995, just 3 lucky losers have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam – David Goffin (2012 Roland Garros), Stephane Robert (2014 Australian Open) and Corentin Moutet (2022 US Open).
- By both reaching the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time here, Mpetshi Perricard and Fils have become the **49th and 50th Frenchmen in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at the Grand Slams** – and the 26th and 27th Frenchmen in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon.
- As No. 1 seed in **Wimbledon qualifying**, Mpetshi Perricard defeated Ugo Blanchet (FRA) 62 75 and Antoine Escoffier (FRA) 76(5) 62 before falling to falling to Maxime Janvier (FRA) 67(10) 75 76(4) 76(5) in the final round of qualifying. He gained entry to the main draw following Alejandro Davidovich Fokina's withdrawal due to a back injury last Sunday.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Mpetshi Perricard fell in the 1st round as a wild card at Roland Garros (l. David Goffin) and fell to Hugo Grenier in the final round of qualifying at the Australian Open. He also lost in the 1st round in his only other Grand Slam main draw appearance – as a wild card at 2023 Roland Garros (l. Genaro Alberto Olivieri).
- **Prior to competing in qualifying here**, Mpetshi Perricard qualified for the main draw at both Stuttgart and Queen's. He reached the 2nd round as a qualifier at Queen's (d. Ben Shelton, l. Billy Harris) but fell in the 1st round at Stuttgart (l. Musetti). His only appearance on grass, at any level, prior to this year came at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch, when he qualified for the main draw but fell to Jordan Thompson in the 1st round.

- Mpetshi Perricard's best result in 2024 is winning his **first Tour-level title** on his 4th Tour-level appearance as a wild card at Lyon (d. Tomas Martin Etcheverry). His only other Tour-level appearances prior to Wimbledon this season came at Roland Garros, Stuttgart and Queen's.
- Also in 2024, Mpetshi Perricard won his **2nd, 3rd and 4th Challenger-level titles** – at Nottingham 1 (GBR) (d. Matteo Martineau), Morelos (MEX) (d. Nicolas Mejia), and Acapulco (MEX) (d. Adam Walton). He also reached the semifinals at the San Luis Potosi Challenger (MEX) (l. Matias Soto) and the quarterfinals at the Lille Challenger (FRA) (l. Pierre-Hugues Herbert).
- Mpetshi Perricard's 5-set victory against Sebastian Korda in the 1st round here was his **first victory in a 5-set match**. He lost the 2 other 5-set matches he has contested – to Olivieri in the 1st round at Roland Garros last year and to Goffin in the 1st round at Roland Garros this year.
- Mpetshi Perricard **broke the Top 100 for the first time** after winning the title at Lyon in May. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 58 this week.
- Mpetshi Perricard was a **successful junior**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 4 in July 2021. He reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Fils) and won the boys' doubles title at Roland Garros alongside Fils the same year. He never contested the boys' singles event at Wimbledon.
- Mpetshi Perricard is coached by Emmanuel Planque.
