On court today...

- For the 2nd straight year, Novak Djokovic faces an Italian opponent in a Wimbledon semifinal, with Lorenzo Musetti bidding to become the 3rd Italian player to defeat Djokovic at a Grand Slam, after Jannik Sinner and Marco Cecchinato. Djokovic will hope that today's clash ends similarly to his semifinal here last year he defeated Sinner in straight sets to remain unbeaten in Wimbledon semifinal matches since 2012, when he fell to Roger Federer in the last 4. For Musetti, a victory today would see him become just the 2nd Italian man in history to reach a Wimbledon final, after Matteo Berrettini in 2021.
- Carlos Alcaraz and Daniil Medvedev are facing off in a Wimbledon semifinal for the 2nd year in a row, with Alcaraz having defeated Medvedev in straight sets in the last 4 here last year en route to his first Wimbledon title. This will be the pair's 3rd meeting in a Grand Slam semifinal overall after Medvedev won when the pair contested a semifinal clash at the US Open last year. A win for Alcaraz today will see him equal Manuel Santana's mark of 4 Grand Slam final appearances, with only Rafael Nadal ahead of him on the all-time list for most Grand Slam final appearances by a Spanish man. Medvedev, meanwhile, is aiming to reach his 7th Grand Slam final and become the 44th player in the Open Era to reach the Wimbledon men's singles final.
- If Alcaraz and Djokovic both reach the final here for the 2nd straight year, they will become the 9th pair of players in the Open Era to contest multiple Wimbledon men's singles finals. It will also be the first time that the same pair of players have contested the men's singles final here in back-to-back years since 2014-15.

A 7th meeting for Djokovic and Musetti, their 3rd at a Grand Slam and their first on grass. Both of their previous meetings at the Grand Slams have gone to 5 sets, with Djokovic recovering from 0-2 down before Musetti retired in the 5th set of their meeting in the round of 16 at 2021 Roland Garros on Musetti's Grand Slam debut, and recording another 5-set victory in the 3rd round at Roland Garros this year.

Djokovic (37 years 53 days) is 14 years 285 days older than Musetti (22 years 133 days). This is the largest age gap between players in a Wimbledon men's singles semifinal match in the Open Era and the 6th-largest age gap between players in a Grand Slam men's singles semifinal match in the Open Era. Djokovic is facing an Italian player in a Wimbledon semifinal for the 2nd straight year, having defeated Jannik Sinner in the semifinals here last year. He lost his only other Grand Slam semifinal match against an Italian player, falling to Sinner at the Australian Open this year.

Musetti is bidding to become the 3rd Italian player to defeat Djokovic at a Grand Slam – after Marco Cecchinato in the quarterfinals at 2018 Roland Garros and Sinner at the Australian Open this year. Djokovic has won the 18 other matches he has contested against Italian opponents at the Grand Slams.

Djokovic has won 2 of the 4 matches he has played against Italian players at Tour-level in 2024 – he fell to Sinner at the Australian Open and to Luca Nardi in the 3rd round at Indian Wells-1000, before defeating Musetti at both Monte Carlo-1000 and Roland Garros. He has a 52-8 win-loss record against Italian players at Tour-level overall.

Djokovic is also bidding to reach his 37th Grand Slam final and extend his all-time record for most Grand Slam men's singles finals reached. He claimed sole ownership of the record, ahead of Federer, by reaching his 32nd Grand Slam final at 2022 Wimbledon.

At 37 years 53 days, Djokovic is bidding to become the first player in the Open Era to reach the Wimbledon men's singles final on 3 occasions after turning 35. • Djokovic has a **9-3 win-loss record in Wimbledon semifinals**. He has won the last 8 semifinal matches he has contested here, having not lost a Wimbledon semifinal since falling to Federer in 2012. He has a 10-1 win-loss record in semifinal matches at the Australian Open, a 10-3 win-loss record in semifinal matches at the US Open and a 7-5 win-loss record in semifinal matches at Roland Garros.

• Djokovic has a **36-12 win-loss record in Grand Slam semifinals**. Since the beginning of the 2015 season, he has won 22 of the 24 Grand Slam semifinals he has contested, with his only defeats in Grand Slam semifinals in that time coming against Dominic Thiem at 2019 Roland Garros and against Jannik Sinner at the Australian Open this year.

By defeating Francisco Cerundolo in the round of 16 at Roland Garros this year for his 370th Grand Slam match-win, he claimed sole ownership of the all-time record for most Grand Slam singles matches won among men and women, ahead of Federer.

- By reaching his 13th Wimbledon semifinal, Djokovic has equalled Federer's **all-time record for most Wimbledon men's singles semifinal appearances**.
- By reaching his 49th Grand Slam semifinal, Djokovic has extended his all-time record for most Grand Slam men's singles semifinal appearances.
- By reaching the semifinals here this year, Djokovic has become the **3rd man in the Open Era to reach the semifinals at Wimbledon aged 37 or older** after Rosewall (who reached the semifinals here aged 39 years 246 days in 1974) and Federer (who reached the semifinals here aged 37 years 240 days in 2019). (NB ages calculated at end of the tournament)
- By reaching his first Grand Slam semifinal since turning 37, Djokovic has become the **5th man in the Open Era to reach the semifinals at the Grand Slams aged 37 or older** after Rosewall (6 Grand Slam semifinals appearances aged 37 or older), Federer (3) and Jimmy Connors and Pancho Gonzales (both one).
- Last year here, Djokovic reached his **9th Wimbledon final**, falling to Carlos Alcaraz in 5 sets. On his 8 other appearances in Wimbledon finals, he won the title in 2011 (d. Rafael Nadal), 2014 (d. Federer), 2015 (d. Federer), 2018 (d. Kevin Anderson), 2019 (d. Federer), 2021 (d. Matteo Berrettini) and 2022 (d. Nick Kyrgios) and finished runner-up in 2013 (l. Andy Murray).
- Djokovic is bidding to win his 8th Wimbledon title and equal Federer's all-time record for the most Wimbledon men's singles titles won. He is also bidding to equal Federer and Helen Wills Moody in 2nd place on the list for most Wimbledon singles titles won among men and women, behind 9-time Wimbledon champion Martina Navratilova.
- Djokovic won his 22nd, 23rd and 24th Grand Slam titles in 2024 he equalled Nadal's all-time record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles at the Australian Open (d. Stefanos Tsitsipas), claimed sole ownership of the record at Roland Garros (d. Casper Ruud) and equalled Margaret Court's all-time record for most Grand Slam singles titles among men and women at the US Open (d. Daniil Medvedev).

- Djokovic is bidding to win his **25th Grand Slam title** and claim sole ownership of the all-time record for most Grand Slam singles titles won among men and women.
- Djokovic is bidding to become the oldest man in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon title and the first player
 in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon titles after turning 35. In 2022, aged 35 years 49 days, Djokovic
 became the 2nd player in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon aged 35 or older after Federer, who won the title
 here in 2017 aged 35 years 342 days. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **5th Grand Slam title since turning 35** and extend his Open Era record for most Grand Slam singles titles won aged 35 or older. He is also bidding to win his 13th Grand Slam title since turning 30 and extend his Open Era record for most Grand Slam singles titles won aged 30 or older.
- Djokovic has won 38 of his last 39 matches at Wimbledon and 38 of his last 39 Tour-level matches on grass. His defeat to Alcaraz in the final last year ended a 34-match winning streak at Wimbledon he had previously not lost here since retiring due to a right elbow injury in his quarterfinal match against Tomas Berdych in 2017. The defeat to Alcaraz also ended a 34-match Tour-level winning streak on grass he had previously not lost a grass court match since falling to Marin Cilic in the final at 2018 Queen's.
- Djokovic is making his 19th consecutive Wimbledon appearance and contesting his 75th Grand Slam overall. He is in joint-4th place on the Open Era list for most Wimbledon men's singles appearances alongside Fernando Verdasco behind Federer (22 Wimbledon appearances) and Connors and Feliciano Lopez (both 20). He is in 3rd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles appearances behind Federer and Lopez (both 81).
- In Grand Slam play this year, Djokovic reached the semifinals at the Australian Open (I. Sinner) and the quarterfinals at Roland Garros, where he gave a walkover to Ruud due to a right knee injury.
- Djokovic's **other highlights in 2024** are reaching the semifinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (I. Ruud) and Geneva (I. Tomas Machac). He contested just 7 events prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Djokovic did not contest a grass court tournament prior to Wimbledon this year. He is one of just 7 men in the Open Era to have won the title here without playing a warm-up event on grass, achieving the feat in 2011, 2014, 2015, 2019, 2021 and 2022. He is one of 16 players who began the men's singles here who had not competed on grass this season prior to Wimbledon.
- Djokovic is bidding to win his **99th Tour-level title**. He is in 3rd place on the Open Era list for most Tour-level titles won behind Connors (109 Tour-level titles) and Federer (103). Of Djokovic's 98 Tour-level singles titles, 8 have come on grass in addition to his 7 Wimbledon titles, he also won the title on grass at 2017 Eastbourne (d. Gael Monfils). He has won 71 titles on hard courts and 19 titles on clay.
- Djokovic has a 10-2 win-loss record in **5-set matches** at Wimbledon, with his only defeats in 5-set matches here coming against Mario Ancic in the round of 16 in 2006 and against Alcaraz in the final last year. He holds the record for most 5-set matches won at the Grand Slams (38-9) and has a 40-11 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Djokovic holds the record for most weeks ranked No. 1, having held the top ranking for a total of 428 weeks. His most-recent spell as world No. 1 ended last month, when he dropped to No. 3 following his withdrawal from Roland Garros. He rose to No. 2 on 24 June and plays here at the same ranking.
- If he wins today, Djokovic will ensure that he **remains at No. 2 when the new rankings are published on Monday**. Sinner will remain at No. 1 regardless of the outcome of this tournament. Djokovic will drop to No. 3, behind Sinner and Alcaraz, if he loses today and Alcaraz wins the title here.
- Djokovic has played Davis Cup for Serbia since 2004, has a 44-16 win-loss record in the competition and led Serbia to their only title in the competition to date in 2010. Serbia will host Greece in a World Group I tie in September.
- Djokovic is currently without a permanent coach.

- MUSETTI is bidding to reach his first Grand Slam final. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 14th Grand Slam overall.
- Musetti is bidding to become the **3rd Italian player to reach a singles final at Wimbledon** after Matteo Berrettini, who finished as men's singles runner-up here in 2021, and Jasmine Paolini, who has reached the women's singles final here this year.
- Musetti is bidding to become the 6th Italian man in history to reach a Grand Slam final and the 3rd active Italian man to do so, after Berrettini and Jannik Sinner.

- Musetti is also bidding to become the 11th Italian player to reach a Grand Slam singles final after Nicola Pietrangeli (4 Grand Slam final appearances), Francesca Schiavone and Paolini (both 2) and Berrettini, Giorgio de Stefani, Sara Errani, Adriano Panatta, Flavia Pennetta, Sinner and Roberta Vinci (all one).
- If Musetti reached the final here, it will be the **first time in history that Italian players have reached the men's and women's singles finals at a Grand Slam**. With both Musetti and Paolini reaching the semifinals here, it is the 2nd time in history that an Italian man and woman have reached the semifinals at a Grand Slam after Roland Garros this year, when Sinner and Paolini both reached the semifinals.
- Musetti is bidding become the 44th man in the Open Era to reach the Wimbledon final and the 9th active
 player to do so. (NB Daniil Medvedev is also bidding to reach his first Wimbledon final today)

- By reaching the semifinals here, Musetti has become the **4th Italian man in history to reach the semifinals at Wimbledon** after Pietrangeli (1960), Berrettini (2021) and Sinner (2023).
- By reaching the semifinals here, Musetti has become the 11th Italian man in history to reach the semifinals at a Grand Slam after Pietrangeli (5 Grand Slam semifinal appearances), Berrettini, Panatta and Sinner (all 3), Corrado Barazzutti, Giorgio de Stefani and Giuseppi Merlo (all 2) and Uberto de Morpurgo, Marco Cecchinato and Orlando Sirola (all one).
- By reaching the semifinals here, Musetti has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best Grand Slam result was reaching the round of 16 at Roland Garros on 2 occasions on his Grand Slam debut in 2021, when he led Djokovic 2-0 before retiring due to a lower back injury in the 5th set, and in 2023 (I. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Last year here, Musetti reached the 3rd round. He defeated Juan Pablo Varillas and Jaume Munar to record his first Wimbledon match-wins before falling to Hubert Hurkacz.
- In Grand Slam play this year, Musetti reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros, where he defeated Daniel Elahi Galan and Gael Monfils before falling to Djokovic, and the 2nd round at the Australian Open (d. Benjamin Bonzi, I. Luca van Assche).

- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Musetti reached his **first Tour-level final on grass** at Queen's (I. Tommy Paul). He also reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (I. Berrettini).
- Musetti's other Tour-level highlights this season are reaching the quarterfinals at Adelaide (I. Alexander Bublik) and the round of 16 at Miami-1000 (I. Alcaraz). He has contested 2 events at Challenger-level this season, finishing runner-up at both the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (I. Mariano Navone) and the Turin Challenger (ITA) (I. Francesco Passaro).
- Musetti is bidding to defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the first time on his 5th attempt. He has lost all 4 matches he contested against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, all of which have come at Roland Garros to No. 1 Djokovic in the round of 16 in 2021 and the 3rd round this year, to No. 4 Stefanos Tsitsipas in the 1st round in 2022 and to No. 1 Alcaraz in the round of 16 in 2023. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at the Grand Slams is No. 12 Fritz in the quarterfinals here this year.
- Musetti is bidding to end a 10-match losing streak against Top 5 players at Tour-level. He has a 2-16 win-loss record against Top 5 players. He lost the first 6 matches he contested against Top 5 players, then recorded back-to-back victories against Top 5 players defeating No. 4 Casper Ruud in the 3rd round at 2022 Paris-1000 and defeated No. 1 Djokovic in the 3rd round at 2023 Monte Carlo-1000 but has lost all 10 matches he has contested against Top 5 players since then.
- Musetti's 5-set victories against Luciano Darderi and Taylor Fritz here this year were the first 5-set matches he
 has contested at Wimbledon. He has a 4-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Musetti broke the Top 20 for the first time in January 2023 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 15 in June last year. He plays here at No. 25.
- If he wins today, Musetti will rise to a new career-high ranking of No. 14. He will rise to No. 13 if he wins the title here. By reaching the semifinals here, he will return to the Top 20, ranked at least as high as No. 16, when the new rankings are published on Monday.
- Musetti is a former junior world No. 1, reaching the top ranking in June 2019. He won the boys' singles title at the 2019 Australian Open (d. Emilio Nava) and finished runner-up in the boys' singles at the 2018 US Open (I. Thiago Seyboth Wild). He reached the quarterfinals of the boys' singles here in 2018 (I. Jack Draper).
- Musetti made his **Davis Cup** debut for Italy in 2021 and has a 2-3 win-loss record in the competition. Italy will compete in Bologna alongside Canada, Sweden and Chile in Group A at the 2023 Davis Cup Finals.
- Musetti is coached by Simone Tartarini.

A 7th meeting for Alcaraz and Medvedev, their 4th at a Grand Slam and 3rd at Wimbledon. They have split their 2 previous meetings here, with Medvedev winning in straight sets in the 2nd round in 2021 on Alcaraz's Wimbledon debut. Alcaraz won their 2nd meeting here, in the semifinals last year, en route to his first Wimbledon title and 2nd Grand Slam title overall.

This is a 3rd meeting between Alcaraz and Medvedev in a Grand Slam semifinal, with the pair level at 1-1 in Grand Slam semifinal matches. They contested back-to-back Grand Slam semifinals in 2023, with Alcaraz winning at Wimbledon and Medvedev winning at the US Open.

This is the 2nd meeting between Top 5 players at Wimbledon this year, after No. 5 Medvedev's victory over No. 1 Jannik Sinner in the quarterfinals.

Alcaraz has won 2 of the 3 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at Wimbledon – he fell to No. 2 Medvedev here in 2021, but defeated No. 3 Medvedev and No. 2 Novak Djokovic in the semifinals and final here last year.

Alcaraz has won 4 of the last 5 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, with his only defeat to a Top 5 player at the Grand Slams in that time coming against No. 3 Medvedev in the semifinals at the 2023 US Open. He has a 6-4 win-loss record against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams overall.

Alcaraz is bidding to extend a 4-match Tour-level winning streak against Top 5 players. Since losing to No. 1 Djokovic in the semifinals at the 2023 ATP Finals, he has defeated No. 3 Sinner and No. 4 Medvedev in the semifinals and final at Indian Wells-1000 this year, and No. 2 Sinner and No. 4 Alexander Zverev in the semifinals and final at Roland Garros last month. He has a 16-9 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

Medvedev has also won 2 of the 3 matches he has played against Top 5 players at Wimbledon – he defeated No. 3 Stan Wawrinka in the 1st round in 2017 and No. 1 Sinner in the quarterfinals this year, but fell to No. 1 Alcaraz in the semifinals last year.

Medvedev has won 2 of the last 6 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, with his 2 victories coming against No. 1 Alcaraz at the 2023 US Open and No. 1 Sinner here this year. He has a 5-9 winloss record against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams overall.

Medvedev's victory against No. 1 Sinner in the quarterfinals here ended a 5-match Tour-level losing streak against Top 5 players. He had previously not defeated a Top 5 player at Tour-level since defeating No. 5 Andrey Rublev in the group stage at the 2023 ATP Finals. He has a 16-31 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.

- Defending champion **ALCARAZ** is bidding to reach the final here for the 2nd time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 14th Grand Slam overall.
- Alcaraz is bidding to become the 2nd Spanish man in history to reach the final at Wimbledon on multiple occasions, after Rafael Nadal, who won the title here in 2008 and 2010, and finished runner-up in 2006, 2007 and 2011. He is one of 3 Spanish men in history to have reached a Wimbledon final, alongside Nadal and Manuel Santana, who won the title here in 1966. (NB Manuel Alonso-Areyzaga fell in the Wimbledon all-comers' final in 1921)
- Alcaraz is bidding to reach his 4th Grand Slam final and equal Santana in 2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam singles final appearances by a Spanish man.

- By reaching the semifinals here for the 2nd time, Alcaraz has become the **3rd Spanish man in history to reach the semifinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** after Nadal (8 Wimbledon semifinal appearances) and Santana (2).
- By reaching his 6th Grand Slam semifinal, Alcaraz has equalled David Ferrer and Juan Carlos Ferrero in 3rd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam singles semifinal appearances by a Spanish man. Nadal (38 Grand Slam final appearances) and Santana (8) are the only Spanish men in history to have reached more Grand Slam singles semifinals than Alcaraz.
- By reaching his 2nd semifinal here, Alcaraz has become the **8th man in the Open Era to reach multiple Wimbledon semifinals aged 21 or under** after Becker (4 Wimbledon semifinal appearances aged 21 or under) and Borg, Goran Ivanisevic, John McEnroe, Nadal, Andy Roddick and Pete Sampras (all 2).
- By reaching his 6th Grand Slam semifinal, Alcaraz has also equalled Andre Agassi, Borg, Novak Djokovic and Nadal in joint-3rd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles semifinals reached aged 21 or under. Becker and Mats Wilander (8 Grand Slam semifinal appearances aged 21 or under) are the only men in the Open Era to reached more Grand Slam men's singles semifinals aged 21 or under than Alcaraz.
- Last year here, Alcaraz won his **first Wimbledon title**, defeating Djokovic in 5 sets in the final. He became the 3rd Spanish man to win the title here and, aged 20 years 72 days, became the 3rd-youngest player in the Open Era to win the men's singles title here, after Becker (who won his first 2 Wimbledon titles aged 17 years 227 days in 1985 and aged 18 years 226 days in 1986) and Borg (who won his first Wimbledon title aged 20 years 27 days in 1976).
- Alcaraz has won 3 Grand Slam titles on 3 different surfaces. He won his first Grand Slam title at the 2022 US
 Open (d. Casper Ruud) and won his most-recent Grand Slam title at 2024 Roland Garros (d. Alexander Zverev).
 He became the first man in the Open Era to win his first 3 Grand Slam titles on different surfaces and, aged 21
 years 36 days, became the youngest man in the Open Era to win 3 Grand Slam titles on different surfaces.
- Alcaraz is bidding to become the 9th man in the Open Era to retain the Wimbledon title after Rod Laver,
 John Newcombe, Borg, McEnroe, Becker, Sampras, Roger Federer and Djokovic.
- Alcaraz is bidding to become the 3rd player in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon men's singles titles aged 21 or under – after Becker and Borg.
- Alcaraz is also bidding to win his 4th Grand Slam title and equal the Open Era record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles won aged 21 or under – alongside Becker, Borg and Wilander.
- Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year, Alcaraz reached the quarterfinals at the Australian Open (I. Zverev).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Alcaraz reached the 2nd round as defending champion at Queen's (d. Francisco Cerundolo, I. Jack Draper). The defeat to Draper ended Alcaraz's 13-match winning streak on grass, with his last defeat on grass having come in the round of 16 at 2022 Wimbledon, when he fell to Sinner.

- Alcaraz's other highlights in 2024 are winning the title at Indian Wells-1000 (d. Medvedev) and reaching the semifinals at Buenos Aires (l. Nicolas Jarry) and the quarterfinals at Miami-1000 (l. Grigor Dimitrov) and Madrid-1000 (l. Andrey Rublev). He is one of 10 players to have won multiple Tour-level titles prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Alcaraz has won 12 of the 13 five-set matches he has contested, including his 5-set victory against Frances
 Tiafoe in the 3rd round here this year. His only defeat in a 5-set match came against Matteo Berrettini in the 3rd
 round at the 2022 Australian Open. He became the first man in the Open Era to win the Roland Garros title after
 winning 5-set matches in both the semifinals and the final, defeating Sinner in the semifinals before defeating
 Zverev in the final. He has won all 3 five-set matches he has contested at Wimbledon.
- Aged 19 years 130 days, Alcaraz became the youngest world No. 1 in history after winning the title at the 2022 US Open. He has been ranked as world No. 1 for 36 weeks, most recently between June and September 2023. He plays here at No. 3.
- If he wins today, Alcaraz will ensure that he **remains at least at No. 3 when the new rankings are published on Monday**. He will rise to No. 2 if he wins the title here and Djokovic loses in the semifinals. Sinner will remain at No. 1 regardless of the outcome of this tournament. Alcaraz will drop to No. 5 if he loses today.
- Alcaraz led Spain to victory at the 2018 Junior Davis Cup Finals in Budapest, defeating France in the title
 match. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 22 in January 2020 and his best performance in the junior
 events at the Grand Slams was his guarterfinal finish in the boys' singles here in 2019.
- Alcaraz has played Davis Cup for Spain since 2022 and has won 2 of the 3 matches he has contested in the competition. Spain were awarded a wild card for the 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage and will compete in Group B in Valencia alongside Australia, Czechia and France.
- Alcaraz is coached by former world No. 1 Juan Carlos Ferrero, who reached the quarterfinals here in 2007 and 2009.
- **MEDVEDEV** is bidding to reach the final here for the first time. This is his 6th Wimbledon appearance and his 29th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Medvedev is bidding to become the 44th man in the Open Era to reach the Wimbledon final and the 9th active player to do so. (NB Lorenzo Musetti is also bidding to reach his first Wimbledon final today)

- By reaching the semifinals here for the 2nd time, Medvedev is one of 7 active players to reach the men's singles semifinals at Wimbledon on multiple occasions after Novak Djokovic (who has reached his 13th semifinal here), Rafael Nadal (8 Wimbledon semifinal appearances), Andy Murray (7) and Alcaraz, Richard Gasquet and Milos Raonic (all 2).
- By reaching his 9th Grand Slam semifinal, Medvedev has equalled Stan Wawrinka in 4th place on the list for most Grand Slam men's singles semifinal appearances among active players. Djokovic (who has reached his 49th Grand Slam semifinal here), Nadal (38 Grand Slam semifinal appearances) and Murray (21) are the only active players to have reached the men's singles semifinals at the Grand Slams more often than Medvedev.
- By reaching the semifinals here, Medvedev has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the semifinals here last year (I. Alcaraz).
- Medvedev won his **first Grand Slam title** at the 2021 US Open, defeating Djokovic in straight sets and ending both Djokovic's bid for the Grand Slam and his 27-match Grand Slam winning streak.
- Medvedev reached his 6th Grand Slam final at the Australian Open this year, falling to Jannik Sinner in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead. He has a 1-5 win-loss record in Grand Slam finals, having also finished runner-up at the US Open in 2019 (I. Nadal) and 2023 (I. Djokovic) and at the Australian Open in 2021 (I. Djokovic) and 2022 (I. Nadal).
- If Medvedev wins his 2nd major title here on his 10th Grand Slam appearance since winning his first, he will go 4th on the Open Era list for most attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam men's singles title behind Marat Safin (14 attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam title) and Diokovic and Gustavo Kuerten (both 12).
- Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year, Medvedev reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros (I. Alex de Minaur).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Medvedev reached the 2nd round at Halle (d. Nuno Borges, I. Zhang Zhizhen).
- Medvedev's **best results in 2024** are runner-up finishes at the Australian Open and Indian Wells-1000 (I. Alcaraz). He also reached the semifinals at Dubai (I. Ugo Humbert) and Miami-1000 (I. Sinner) and the quarterfinals at Madrid-1000, where he retired against Jiri Lehecka due to a right hip injury.
- Medvedev has won one Tour-level grass court title at 2021 Mallorca (d. Sam Querrey). Of his 19 other
 Tour-level titles, 18 have come on hard courts, with his only clay court title to date coming at Rome-1000 last year.
 His 20 titles have been won at 20 different events, which is a Tour-level record.

- Medvedev has won 5 of the last 6 five-set matches he has contested, including his win over Sinner in the quarterfinals here this year. His only defeat in a 5-set match in that time came against Sinner in the final at the Australian Open. Having won 3 five-set matches en route to the final at the Australian Open this year, he became the 12th man in the Open Era to contest 4 five-set matches at a single Grand Slam tournament. He has a 3-4 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Wimbledon and an 8-10 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Medvedev **became world No. 1** on 28 February 2022, becoming the first player other than the 'Big 4' (Djokovic, Roger Federer, Murray and Nadal) to hold the top ranking since Andy Roddick in February 2004. He held the No. 1 ranking for 16 weeks during 2022 but is yet to return to the No. 1 ranking. He plays here at No. 5.
- If he wins today, Medvedev will ensure that he **rises to No. 3 when the new rankings are published on Monday** he would then remain at No. 3, behind Sinner and Djokovic, regardless of his result in the final. He will remain at No. 5 if he loses today.
- Medvedev reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 13 in January 2014. His best performance in the boys' singles here was reaching the 2nd round in 2013 (d. Hong Seong Chan, I. Nikola Milojevic).
- Medvedev is coached by Gilles Cervara.
