**Notes:**

- Q = Qualifier; FRQ = Final Round of Qualifying
- Players must have played in, and won, at least one qualifying match to be eligible to earn WTT ranking points
- In 2019, Doubles events at WTT tournaments awarded the same points between Quarter-Final and Final rounds as used in Singles and no Doubles points were awarded for a loss in R16
- No Doubles points awarded from 2020 onwards

**Ranking Calculations**

WTT ranking lists are released each Monday and are based on WTT points earned in the previous 52 weeks. A player's best 14 results are used to determine each player's ranking.

WTT ranking points earned will be processed a minimum of one (1) week following the completion of the Tournament.

**Online WTT Ranking Breakdown**

WTT ranking breakdowns on individual player profile pages will only show the 15/25/35 category WTT tournaments where the player could potentially have earned WTT ranking points by having competed in the Singles Qualifying event.

**The WTT Ranking system will be discontinued in 2027**

During 2026, WTT ranking points will be awarded as usual, however, these will count towards ranking calculations during 2026 only.

At the end of 2026, all WTT points will be removed and WTT rankings will no longer be considered for acceptance for any WTT tournament in 2027.

The removal of the WTT ranking will see the use of the World Tennis Number (WTN) increase in importance in relation to entry into professional WTT tournaments. The WTN has seen incredible growth globally and provides a more accurate standard of each player in relation to each other which in turn should maintain the quality of play at all WTT tournaments as the Tour goes from strength to strength.

**Brief History**

In 2019, the ITF introduced the WTT ranking and a new points structure. With the addition of WTT ranking points, the ATP no longer awarded ATP ranking points and the WTA no longer awarded WTA ranking points at \$15,000 category tournaments. The ATP/WTA decision was not well received by players and ATP/WTA ranking points returned to WTT tournaments in August 2019.

Starting in 2020, WTT ranking points were only awarded in Singles Qualifying final round matches at \$15,000 and \$25,000 category tournaments.

WTT ranking points are awarded based upon the round reached. A player's best 14 points totals eligible within the last 52 weeks from each Monday determines a player's WTT ranking.

The WTT ranking system is a 52-week, cumulative system in which the number of WTT Tournament results that comprise a player's ranking is capped at a player's best fourteen (14) Tournament results for Singles and, whilst still available, the best fourteen (14) Tournament results for Doubles.

This system was modified in 2020 and again in 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. WTT points from all tournaments played 4th March 2019 onwards were frozen and therefore remained eligible to be counted in a player's best 14 tournaments.

Subject to any further amendments, the WTT ranking calculation was scheduled to return to a 52 week system as of Week 1 in 2023 using the following procedure:

- All remaining WTT points from 2019 (March to December) drop on 4th April 2022
- WTT points from 2020 drop on a weekly basis from January 2022
- WTT points from 2021 are dropped on a weekly basis, as normal during 2022
- WTT ranking returns to a standard 52-week system in Week 1 2023
