


INTERNATIONAL TENNIS FEDERATION

ITF WHEELCHAIR TENNIS PLAYER COUNCIL







The ITF has established an ITF Wheelchair Tennis Player Council to represent the interests of wheelchair tennis players participating across ITF Wheelchair Tennis competitions.

The purpose of this Player Council is:

- To represent the interests of all players across all divisions, rankings and world regions involved in ITF Wheelchair Tennis Competitions
- To advise and make recommendations to the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Committee on all issues of concern to players including but not limited to the ITF Rules and Regulations.

The Player Council is appointed for a period of 2 years and is administered by the ITF. It consists of:

7	Current Players	A Current Player is defined as having a 2018 IPIN Membership and a current ITF Wheelchair Tennis Ranking.		
1	Former Player	A Former Player is a playerdefined as a player who has not competed in any ITF santioned tournaments in the last two (2) years and/or has officially retired with the ITF. They must have previously competed in one or more of the Paralypics, BNP Paribas World Team Cup, UNIQLO Wheelchair Doubles Masters or NEC Wheelchair Tennis Masters.		
1	Coach	A Coach is defined as holding a national coaching qualification and must have coached or be coaching a player within the Top 100 Men or Top 50 Women or Quads on the ITF Singles Ranking.		

The current Player Council was elected on 30th August 2018 following a formal nomination and election process. Individual members were elected based on votes submitted by ITF registered wheelchair tennis players and according to specific, published selection criteria that ensure broad representation of geographical regions, divisions and ranking bands. They will meet up to three times per year, details of which will be published here in due course.

The elected members below will individually represent players within their own specified division, ranking band and geographical world region.

Lucy Shuker is a T4 Paraplegic as a result of a motorbike accident in 2001. On her release from hospital she was introduced to wheelchair tennis by former Quad World No.1 Pete Norfolk. Lucy has since competed in the UNIQLO Wheelchair Tennis Tour since 2003 and has made appearances at all four major tennis Grand Slams and reached a career best ranking of World No.5 in Singles and World No.3 in Doubles. Representing Great Britain at 11 World Team Cups and 3 Paralympic Games, Lucy's proudest achievements are the 2 Paralympic Bronze Medals she won alongside fellow brit Jordanne Whiley in the women's doubles event. As one of the most disabled women UNIQLO Wheelchair Tennis Tour, Lucy aims to bring a balanced view to the Player Council, helping to develop a professional and sustainable tour that holds player's interests and welfare in high regard whilst working to appeal to media and sponsors.
